BLOXHAM SCHOOL ARCHIVES

CLASSIFICATION SCHEME

A simple and flexible scheme has been used to divide the existing records, and to enable additional records to be added to a series or to the scheme as a whole.

There are four main groups, with subdivisions for classes within each group. The documents within each class are distinguished by a running number. In most cases it is unnecessary to identify individual papers within a bundle, but where desireable (as in the case of the Egerton correspondence) a piece-number, folio or page number can be added.

Strictly, the Egerton papers should have been divided among the other classes of administrative records, correspondence and accounts, but it seemed better to treat them as a separate group.

The documents have all been stamped and numbered for identification, the mark normally being found endorsed on loose papers or inside the cover of volumes. A pencil mark has been used when the ink stamp would have been unsightly.

NEW ACCESSIONS

New accessions should be fitted within the frame of the classification scheme. Every document must be marked for identification, but do not use the rubber stamp where it will deface the document, and write in record ink, indian ink or pencil - never biro or felt-tip pen. Loose papers should be filed with a tag, or clipped together with a non-rusting brass or plastic paper clip. Avoid bulky bundles and files. Do not cram the boxes over-full.

DISPLAY

Do not write on documents or photographs. Do not pierce them with pins - drawing pins alongsidewith the head overlapping and holding the document is effective and does no damage. Do not use adhesives, especially of the sellotape variety. Ideally documents on display should be protected, for example with a clear plastic sheet, but at least discourage people from leaning on them, handling them, and pointing with biros, cigarettes and similar dangerous implements.

INTRODUCTION

Bloxham School was started by Revd J.W. Hewett in 1853, but his ambitious building plans combined with excessive High Church practices resulted in his downfall in 1857. Only one or two records of his school survive at Bloxham, though papers relating to it and to his bankruptcy are in the Bodleian Library, Oxford (MS.Oxf.Dioc.Pprs. c.1736 and MS.Top.Oxon. f.40).

In September 1859 Revd P.R. Egerton, then a young and unsettled curate at Deddington, bought the derelict building and started his own school. Egerton aimed to meet the educational need of a 'middle-class school' with Anglican Catholic principles primarily for boys who would go straight into business. From a handful of boys in January 1860 the numbers rose to nearly 200 in 20 years. Subsequently the school suffered seriously from competition from the government-supported Board Schools and by the end of the century there were less than 100 boys.

The archives now kept in the office of the Old Bloxhamist Society at the school provide ample evidence of Egerton's meticulous planning and progress, his worries over finance, and his repeated attempts to ensure that his private school should survive him. In turn he approached the Woodard Corporation of St Nicolas, Lancing in 1859-60, Keble College, Oxford in 1879, Woodard again in 1880, before establishing a Bloxham School Trust in 1884. Finally, affiliation with the Woodard Corporation was agreed in 1897, although its independent origin and character, size and distance from the other Woodard schools in the Southern Division kept Bloxham somewhat isolated for many years.

From 1897 the most important archives at the school are the minutes and accounts of the Bloxham Council in the custody of the bursar. Comparatively few other records survive for the period from 1900 to 1960 to illustrate the school's partial recovery before World War I, the depression of the 1920s and 1930s relieved by the building programme and educational policies of the first lay headmaster, V.L. Armitage (1925-40). At the outbreak of World War II the school was again facing a financial crisis and the Council were reputedly considering closure, although this is not recorded in their minutes. These remain the chief source of evidence for the recovery first in numbers and then in buildings and academic standards achieved by K.T.Dewey (1940-52) and R.S. Thompson (1952-66).

Since the centenary year of 1960 there has been a more successful attempt to keep archive copies of school papers, chiefly the printed ones, illustrating the substantial growth of the school and its activities under D.R.G. Seymour (from 1966). There is, however, nothing to match the evidence of the Egerton period - few letters of headmasters, unpublished reports or papers on Council policy, administrative or educational aims and methods, or school activities, the duties of housemasters and chaplain. Even the record value of the school magazine, The Bloxhamist, is variable compared with the factual reporting of earlier issues. Similarly, the photographic records of the school are comparatively more extensive before 1920 than since.
