/6	1868 Apr 22	London [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re visit to Napiers]

/8	1868 May 9	London [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re selling his house]
/9	1868 Jul 30	Patent Office [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re 'Dr Bell's beautiful model reaper' which 'has arrived quite safe']
/10	1868 Aug 20	Watford [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re his health]
/11	1868 Sept 30	London [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re 'bill for a reaping machine made for me to order' which he is 'willing to exchange for Bell's original machine to be placed in the Patent Office Museum']
/12	1868 Oct 1	Patent Office [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re a machine for cutting grain and/or grass]

/13	1868 Oct 2	Britannia Works, Banbury [to] B Woodcroft, Patent Office/ Samuelson & Co, Agricultural Engineers & Machinists, [re machine for cutting grain and grass]
/14	1868 Oct 27	Inchmichael, Errol, Perthshire [to] Mr Smith/Mary Bell, [re sending the "Original Reaping Machine"]
/15	1868 Oct 27	The Manse of Carmyllie [to] F P Smith/Patrick Bell, [re the way the Museum acquired his Reaping Machine]
/16	1868 Oct 30	Patent Office [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re reimbursing Mrs Bell at 'the price of a Perthshire reaping machine']
/17	1868 Nov 2	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/Mary Bell. [She will accept a machine made by Samuelsons, if it is a 'self delivering one', otherwise £30]
/18	1868 Nov 5	Patent Office [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [asking him to ask Mrs Bell if she wants a 'one or two horse reaper']
/19	1868 Nov 5	London [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re machine to be made by Samuelsons for Mrs Bell]
/20	1868 Nov 9	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/M Bell, [asking for 'a descriptive catalogue of Messrs Samuelson's Reaper so that we may choose one it must be a two horse one']
/21	1868 Nov 12	Patent Office [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft, [re sending Samuelson catalogue to Mrs Bell]
/22	1868 Nov 14	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/Mary Bell. [She has despached the old reaper]
/23	1868 Nov 18	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/M Bell. [Having looked at Samuelson's catalogue she does not want one of their reaping machines. She 'will either take one of Bamlett's or the money']
/24	1868 Nov 19	Patent Museum [to] F P Smith/B Woodcroft. [He wishes to see 'the old reaper' the moment it arrives. Mention also of 'the Harrison relics']
/25	1868 Nov 26	(Copy). Patent Office Museum, South Kensington [to] Reverend Patrick Bell/F P Smith, 'Curator', [formally acknowledging receipt of the 'original Reaping Machine' 1826, a model of the same and other items]
/26	1868 Nov 27	Inchmichael [to F P Smith]/Mary Bell. [She would like a machine by Bamlett's of York]

/27	1868 Dec 19	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/Mary Bell, [re the Bamlett's machine]
/28	1868 Dec 23	(Copy). London [to] A C Bamlett/B Woodcroft, [seeking favourable terms for supply of reaper which is to be given (to Mrs Bell) in exchange for the original Bell's reaper]
/29	1868 Dec 23	Patent Office [to] F P Smith/Wm Marwick Michell, [re Woodcroft's letter to Bamletts]
/30	1869 Jan 19	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/Geo Bell. [They have not yet received the reaper]
/31	1869 May 5	Copy. London [to] Mrs Bell/B Woodcroft, [sending condolences on the death of Mr Bell and asking some questions about his reaping machine]
/32	1869 May 5	Copy. Patent Office Museum, South Kensington [to] Mrs Bell, Carmylie/F P Smith, [sending condolences on the loss of her husband, Dr Bell]
/33	1869 May 21	North British Agriculturalist Office, High Street, Edinburgh [to] B Woodcroft/Charles Stevenson, [re looking for articles on Bell's reaping machine]
/34	1869 Jul 20	Inchmichael [to] Mr Smith/Mary Bell. [They have received the reaper]
/35	1877 May 2	[To] The Secretary, Science & Art Department/B Wood- croft, [asking that Bell's Reaping Machine be delivered to the Patent Office Museum from the Loan Collection of Scientific Instruments]
