

JOLIFFE & JOHNSTON, TUG OWNERS

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Introduction

William and Thomas Joliffe established a towage company in 1852, eventually owning a fleet of over 40 tugs. In 1908 they were taken over by the Alexandra Towing Company.

Documents within this collection list the address of the company as 12 Goree Piazzas in 1873, 42 Chapel Street in 1877 and Hargreaves Buildings, 5 Chapel Street from 1879 to 1884. The letterhead of an 1873 invoice for Universal Steam Tug Office, W. & T. Joliffe owners, lists their vessels as: *Great Emperor, Iron Duke, Rover, Tiger, Liverpool, Lion, Renown, Royal Saxon, Empress, Hero, Superb, Triumph, Lioness, Black Eagle* and *Sea Gull.* A similar document in 1884 lists the fleet as: *Great Western, Great Britain, Great Emperor, Commodore, Resolute, Iron Duke, Rover, Tiger, Liverpool, Royal Saxon, North Holland, Empress, Hero, Black Eagle* and *Union.* Later the firm adopted family names for their vessels, for example, *Thomas Joliffe.*

The collection contains records relating to the Joliffe and Johnston families, who also seem to be tug owners, including wills and business papers including receipts for towage. The majority of the collection covers the period 1860-1890. However, there are 6 items from 1955 relating to attempts to trace the history and ownership of Tyne Steam Tug and Warspite Steam Tug Company vessels.

These records accompanied a collection of paintings purchased by National Museums Liverpool in July 1997. The paintings are held in the Maritime History Department's collections, the documents were transferred to the Maritime Archives & Library.

The collection is accessible to any reader within the Maritime Archives & Library Searchroom.

Related collections held by the Maritime Archives & Library include the archives of the Alexandra Towing Company and several books on tugs and towing within the Library collections including *British Steam Tugs*, by P.N. Thomas and *Take the Strain, a History of Alexandra Towing*, by Tim Nicholson.
