Records of Dr Isaac Banks, Aberdare

Isaac Banks, MD, is recorded in Kelly's Directory from 1895 to 1920. In 1895 he is described as Assistant Surgeon to the Cottage Hospital and Industrial School, with a practice at 75-77 Harriet Street, Trecynon. By 1906, he was at the Hollies, Trecynon, serving as Surgeon to the hospital and school and to Bwllfa and Merthyr Dare Collieries Ltd., moving to 2 Park Lane by 1914. In 1920 he was also Public Vaccinator to Aberdare Upper District. Harry Banks, BA, MB, is recorded at the same date at the same practice in 2 Park Lane, Trecynon. Isaac is known to have died in 1941 at the age of 73, his wife Florence Adelaide in 1935 at the age of 64. Harry Banks, their son, was baptised in St Fagan's, Aberdare, in November 1894.
