Administrative/biographical history

Bethany Baptist Church, St Mary Street, Cardiff, is the oldest English Baptist church in Cardiff. The church was formed on 7th September 1806 with 6 members who met in a room opened on 7th July 1806 in the King's Head, St. Mary Street. On 10th July 1807 a new meeting room was opened on land in St. Mary Street, acquired from John Wood, junior. By 1807 membership was 16. In 1809 Tho. Lewis, the first pastor was appointed. A Sunday School was founded in 1813. By 1820 the church had 59 members and a new chapel was built by subscription and opened 3rd October 1821. By 1827 membership had risen to 96 and new galleries were opened in November 1827 and an enlargement of the existing building was carried out in April 1840.

The first meeting of the Carmarthen and Glamorgan English Baptist Association took place at Bethany Baptist Church in 1857.

In 1861 membership was 465 and in 1857 there were 390 attending the Sunday school. A new building was opened in May 1865 with accommodation for 943 worshippers. A new Sunday school was built in 1878.

By 1916 membership had declined to 834 and the number of Sunday scholars to 225. Contributory factors in this decline were the movement of population from the centre of Cardiff and the proliferation of English Baptist churches, often under the auspices of Bethany itself in Cardiff and Penarth. By 1906 there were 14 churches.

Bethany Baptist church eventually followed the movement of population by transferring the chapel to Rhiwbina. The last service was held in the St. Mary Street building in November 1963 and the first service in the new building in September 1964.

[The former Bethany English Baptist church building in St. Mary Street had been incorporated into the premises of Jas. Howell and Co. Ltd, and it is possible to see the façade of the former chapel in Wharton Court in Wharton Street, where there is also a memorial to Rawlins White, who was martyred in 1555, during the Marian persecution.
