The practice had moved there from across the street in Baltic House under the name of Maclean, Handcock and Hann before 1932 and previous to that, H.B. Hann (later of Llewellyn and Hann) had been a partner in another practice, Harrison and Hann based in Bute Street, Cardiff, and later Caerphilly from 1909/10 to around 1920. Llewellyn and Hann solicitors eventually merged with Edwards Geldard in 1982.
