E1. Awards Committee minutes, 29 January 1955-12 October 2006

Minutes of meetings of Awards Committee (1955-1967), of the (renamed) Awards and Ethical Committee (1968-1984), and of the (renamed) Awards Committee (1985-1989). Meetings were usually held twice a year. Although the Awards Committee was known as the Awards and Ethical Committee from 1968 to 1984, it rarely dealt with ethical matters (see ACE E3-3). For minutes and papers of the Ethical Committee, see ACE J6 and J7.

E2. Awards Committee papers, 1955-1997

Supporting papers for meetings of Awards Committee, including duplicate minutes, agendas, correspondence, adjudicators' marks and comments, summaries of awards available giving criteria and value.

gap 1966-1974

Meetings were usually held twice a year after 1992 become ones a year. Before 1964, some Committee correspondence was filed separately from the supporting papers (see ACE E3).

E3. Awards Committee correspondence, 1955-1983

Correspondence relating to business and administration of Awards Committee. gap 1964-1977

After 1964, the main series of Committee correspondence was filed together with the supporting papers for meetings (see ACE E2).

E4. Committee on Fellowship minutes, 26 February 1966-28 May 1997

Fellowship Committee founded in 1967 and first "ordinary" Fellowship by Nomination in 1968. In 1989, a second route for College members to attain Fellowship was opened with Fellowship by Assessment. This ran alongside Fellowship by Nomination until 2006 when both routes were abolished in favour of a single "unified" route of self nomination.

[Honorary Fellowship from 1956. Fellows Ad Eundem Gradum introduced in 1979 - which were awarded to non GP medics practising in the UK. Honorary Fellowship (both under the Awards Committee). FAEG was closed in 1992 and merged with Honorary Fellowship - the number of Honorary Fellows being increased to 100]

Minutes, agenda and memorandum of a meeting of the Fellowship Court of Electors (1966), and minutes of meetings of the Fellowship Nomination Committee Working Party (1967), and the Committee on Fellowship (initially called the Fellowship Nomination Committee, then the Committee of Fellows) (1967-1997). E5. Committee on Fellowship Correspondence, 1971-2007

The Fellowship Committee was founded in 1967 and first "ordinary" Fellowship by Nomination in 1968. In 1989, a second route for College members to attain Fellowship was opened with Fellowship by Assessment. This ran alongside Fellowship by Nomination until 2006 when both routes were abolished in favour of a single "unified" route of self nomination.

E6. Committee on Fellowship related papers, 1967-2006

Additional and agenda papers including nominations relating to business conducted by the Committee on Fellowship, previously the Committee of Fellows, previously the Fellowship Nomination Committee. Several gaps. See also ACE E4 Fellowship Minutes; E5 Fellowship Correspondence.

E7. Butterworth Medal papers, 1955-1983

Correspondence and papers concerning award of Butterworth Medals.

E8. Undergraduate Essay Prize, 1963-1990

Correspondence and papers concerning the Undergraduate Essay Prize, previously the Public Welfare Foundation Prize essay competition.

This competition was originally financed in 1956 by the Public Welfare Foundation Fund of the USA via Mrs. Charles Marsh (£320). It was to be open all medical students in the UK, Eire, Australia and New Zealand, who would be required to submit a history of approximately 1500 words, of a patient seen in the patients own home, or in the general practitioner's consulting rooms on at least three occasions. It would be necessary for the student to have been introduced to the patient by the family doctor concerned who, together with the dean of the medical school, would be required to countersign the application form. Originally administered by the Undergraduate Education Committee [See ACE H1, ACE H2, ACE H23]

When this funding ceased, after the 1964 award, the College decided to fund the competition themselves under a new title "Undergraduate Essay Prize".

The competition was finally discontinued following the 1989 award. Gaps 1966-1972 and 1973-1980.

E9. Pfizer Postgraduate Grant papers, 1956-1966

E10. Nuffield Travelling Fellowship papers, 1964-1969

Correspondence and reports concerning award of Nuffield Travelling Fellowships.

E11. Upjohn Travelling Fellowship and Essay Prize papers, 1957-1984

Correspondence and papers concerning award of Upjohn Travelling Fellowships (1957-1982). From 1983, it became an essay prize in therapeutics aimed at vocational trainees in their final year and Principles in general practice who are within their first five years. The prize was allocated in eight parts of £250 to four award winners in each of the two sections. In 1985, Upjohn Limited withdrew support for the prize due to financial constraints.

E12. Baron Dr Ver Heyden De Lancey Memorial Award, 1977-1995

Correspondence relating to administration of this award. This award was funded by the De Lancey and De La Hanty Foundation Limited in commemoration of the Baron, one of the first hundred Founder members of the College. Except for the year 1983, the award was made annually from 1977 until 1994, when funding ceased.

E13. Committee on Fellowship Working Party on Remote Members, 1970-1972

Correspondence relating to election of remote members to fellowship. See also ACE E4 to E5, E12 and E14.

E14. Joint Fellowship & Membership Working Group, 1984-1985

Records relating to working group, which first met in January 1984, set up to review the basis on which RCGP Fellowship was being awarded.

E15. James Mackenzie Prize, 1961-2004

Records relating to administration of James Mackenzie Prize.

The Prize was awarded to a general practitioner in the Commonwealth who had undertaken or published valuable work during the previous five years, the intention being to reward good clinical or research work done in general practice.

The James Mackenzie Prize was established in 1956 when £7000 was invested in securities. The income from the awards was paid into a bank account in the name of the Mackenzie Prize trustees. It was awarded every five years; the first award was made in 1961 and the final award 1996. The fund was wound up in December 2004.

E16. Kuenssberg Prize, 1979-1986

The Kuenssberg Prize is an occasional award which was first made in 1983 and wound up by 1996. Although an extra award was made in 1999 to Donald Crombie. It was endowed by Ekke Kuenssberg.

Records, mainly correspondence, relating to administration of the Kuenssberg Prize. NB The Katherina Von Kuenssberg Travel Prize was endowed in 1979 by Katherina's daughter Imre Heinz (sister of Ekke Kuenssberg) and as part of the College appeal and was originally to assist young practitioners (under 40) wishing to undertake practice research (with a preference, though not exclusively in Canada where Mrs. Heinz lived. It was first awarded in 1982 and administered by the Scientific Foundation Board. The award was transferred to the International Committee in 1989 [See ACE P9]

E17. Stanning Overseas Fellowship, 1971-1981

Records, mainly correspondence, relating to administration of the Stanning Overseas Fellowship and applications for awards.

E18. Sir Harry Jephcott Visiting Professorship, 1971-1990

Records, relating to administration of the Sir Harry Jephcott Visiting Professorship. Files variously contain correspondence, curricula vitae and reports.

E19. Wolfson Foundation Overseas Travelling Professorship, 1971-1985

Records, mainly correspondence, relating to administration of the Wolfson Foundation Overseas Travelling Professorship.

gap 1976-1980

First awarded in 1972. During 1982, the title of this award was discussed and changed to a Fellowship but soon reverted to a Professorship.

E20. Astra Research Award, 1977-1989

Records, mainly correspondence, relating to administration of the Astra Research Award.

Three awards, funded by Astra Pharmaceuticals Limited, were made annually from 1978 until 1985 (not 1984) for research during vocational training. These were discontinued and replaced from 1987 by one award for a Study Fellowship. In 1988, an additional fellowship was made available, funded by Astra and Shell.

E21. Duphar Research Award, 1978- 1987

Records, mainly correspondence, relating to administration of the Duphar Research Award.

Funded by Duphar Laboratories Limited and first awarded in 1980.

E22. Sir Jules Thorn Charitable Trust, 1980-1988

Correspondence regarding grant of £30,000 from Sir Jules Thorn in 1980 towards a research project [resulting from the 1980 College Appeal to fund attachment for young doctors to be trained in research methodology]. Some of the contents of this file are confidential.

E23. Alastair Donald Essay Prize, 1982-1983

Correspondence

E24. Hoechst Essay Prize, 1982-1985

Correspondence and entries Prize only lasted one year. Aim "to encourage high standards in the diagnosis and manage of chronic disabling conditions.

E25. Graves Memorial Prize, 1980-1982

Correspondence concerning appropriate ways of commemorating John Graves (1923-1980) it was decided to use money for an elective for a trainee in the North East Thames Region.

John Graves, with his wife Valerie started a Medical Recording Service 1957 - sending tapes and slide educational programmes by post to GP's around the country. See ACE L9 for files concerning this project.

E26. Rose Prize, 2004-2005

Correspondence, minutes and entries from joint History of Medicine Prize with the Society of Apothecaries.

This biennial prize first awarded in 2005 commemorates Fraser Rose founder of the RCGP and William Rose, Apothecary of London, whose court case of 1701-1704

established the legal foundation of General Practice in England.

The prize is awarded for a piece of original unpublished research (with a demonstrable emphasis on original primary source material) and it should have been undertaken in the previous two years. It should also be appropriately illustrated. Any topic on the History of British General Practice may be chosen. Typescript entries should not exceed 8,000 words, but submissions in other media will be accepted provided that they are of comparable intellectual rigour. Publication will be encouraged.

The winner(s) have their name(s) engraved on the plinth of the Rose Bowl, which they keep for two years, and they will also receive a suitably inscribed certificate. The award will either be presented at Apothecaries' Hall or at The College and the winner will be expected to give a short presentation of their work.

E27. Roche Award Prize, 1980-2005

Correspondence, minutes and entries Originally Roche Prize 1981-, then Roche Syntex prize, Roche Prize

To enable GP Registrars to undertake original work during the course of their vocational training. To encourage GP registrars to plan, execute and present the results of this work in a scientific manner.

E28. RCGP/National Dairy Council Practice Team Nutrition Award, 1989-1997

The Practice Team Nutrition Award is a joint award by RCGP and National Dairy Council (NDC) and was established in 1989 for College members. The Award is an extension of NDC's GP Nutrition Service supporting projects which aim to improve eating habits of the practice population as a whole or of specific subsections. It is organised and administered by RCGP and sponsored by the NDC. The panel of judges consists of two RCGP members, one eminent dietitian and one member of NDC. The research prize is worth up to £8,000. The winner is announced at the College's Annual General Meeting.

Correspondence, memoranda, agendas and notes of meetings concerning the organisation, promotion and administration of the award. Also includes papers and applications with details of proposed projects.

E29. "Great Expectations" GP Trainees Bursary Fund, 1986-1991

The Fund was set up following the 1985 Trainee Conference held in Nottingham. Its aim is to assist GP trainees evaluating an area of family medicine either by undertaking a research project or travelling to study an aspect of primary health care. There are three or four prizes of £200 awarded each year. Submissions will be considered by an awards panel twice a year, usually in October and March. The Fund is administered by the RCGP but the awards panel consists of trainees and recent trainees. Presentations may be made at the College's Annual General Conference and at the Spring Meeting.

From 2006 known as the GP Registrar Bursary.

Correspondence, memoranda and papers concerning the organisation of the award. Also includes applications with details of projects and promotional leaflets.

E30. Anne Hamilton Prize, 1978-1997

The Anne Hamilton Prize is awarded in memory of the wife of Dr Sidney Hamilton. Anna Hamilton was a doctor who contracted polio but for many years continued to practice as a doctor while in a wheelchair. A prize of £500 will be awarded for the best essay which demonstrates the author's understanding of the importance of sympathetic communication between a patient and all those providing care. The essay should include personal work or experience in this field. The prize aims to promote the caring aspect 'Caritas' which seems to be in danger of displacement by scientific matters 'Scientia'. It is run every two to four years.

This series contains correspondence, memoranda and papers relating to the organisation of the award. Also includes applications. The prize was not awarded between 1986 and 1990.

the USA via Mrs. Charles Marsh (£320). It was to be open all medical students in the UK, Eire, Australia and New Zealand, who would be required to submit a history of approximately 1500 words, of a patient seen in the patients own home, or in the general practitioner's consulting rooms on at least three occasions. It would be necessary for the student to have been introduced to the patient by the family doctor concerned who, together with the dean of the medical school, would be required to countersign the application form. Originally administered by the Undergraduate Education Committee [See ACE H1, ACE H2, ACE H23]

When this funding ceased, after the 1964 award, the College decided to fund the competition themselves under a new title "Undergraduate Essay Prize".

The competition was finally discontinued following the 1989 award.

It was awarded every five years; the first award was made in 1961 and the final award 1996. The fund was wound up in December 2004.
