

Introduction

This collection of Brickendonbury manorial records, together with the lordship of the manor, formed lot number 5 in the auction sale of lordships of the manor held in 1955. It was purchased by Mr. W.A. Foyle, and the manorial records were subsequently purchased from him in 1956. The sale catalogue (Z1) gives an account of the records and a short historical survey of the lordship.
