In 1899, two brothers, Thomas Arthur and Benjamin George Cobley, formed a grocery business at 62, Rockingham Road and 10, Dalkeith Place, Kettering, trading under the name of Cobley Brothers. Thomas Cobley had served a four year apprenticeship from 1887 under Alfred Lewin, a local grocer and provisions dealer.

In 1919, the two brothers decided to split the business into two parts - B.G. Cobley and Son at 62, Rockingham Road and T.A. Cobley and Son at 10, Dalkeith Place. Thomas Cobley and his son, Wilfred, also purchased the grocery business of J.W. Baines at 26, Newland Street.

In the 1920's, Wilfred Cobley introduced the sale of freshly roasted and ground coffees; an item which remains a speciality of T.A. Cobley and Son today.

In 1929, the firm of T.A. Cobley and Son moved from number 10 to 12, Dalkeith Place until the lease of the premises expired in 1936, when a new shop at 7, Dalkeith Place was built for the business.

Thomas Cobley's grandson, Mr. John Cobley, became a partner in the business in 1957. In 1962, the business of B.G. Cobley and Son closed down and amalgamated with T.A.Cobley and Son. In 1967 the shop at 26, Newland Road was also closed and the whole grocery business was consolidated at 7, Dalkeith Place.

Today the business of T.A. Cobley and Son retains the atmosphere of an old-fashioned grocer's shop with personal service to customers and selling high quality provisions and groceries, specialising in freshly roasted coffee and fine and unusual blends of tea. A delivery service is still maintained throughout Kettering and the surrounding villages.
