## NOTE:

Stanwick Baptist church was formed in 1842 by fifteen local people. By 1850 the congregation had grown to 62 members, 51 children and 12 teachers.

In 1885 the condition of the non-conformist churches in the parish had fallen very low and the Independent Wesleyan society in Stanwick decided to form a union with the Baptists. The Baptist pastors at Ringstead and the Wesleyan Reform ministers at Wellingborough had an oversight of the church.

In 1922 the church underwent an outstanding revival and gained 21 new members. In 1958 the church decided to form a link with Park Road Baptist church in Rushden.
