The manor of Fernhill, anciently Farnhull, was held as of the Castle of Christchurch by a family of the same name. John Farnwood bought the manor in 20-21 Ric. II [1397-98] and devised it together with his moiety of the manor of Allington, to the Warden and Scholars-clerks upon certain trusts. v. under Farnwood's Chantry and Allington. Farnwood's trustees conveyed it to Bishop Bekington & others who
