The king revokes this prohibition and allows the dean and chapter to prosecute their claim for expenses against the said dominus Roger in a Christian court.

He added that he had not ordered the said Richard Barbour and John Orchard to enter the church or any part of it through malice, but with the consent of a certain William Bradley, a monk of the monastery of Alsedr', who was accustomed to sleep and live in the chamber which they had entered, and who taught his pupils there. He had given the key of this chamber to his servant, and sent him with the said Richard Barbour. The latter opened the door to investigate concerning some fish, called stockfish, which William the monk was said to And so the mayor had sent the said Richard have stolen. as a friend of William the monk to inquire secretly concerning the fish, and to preserve as far as possible the good name of the monk and of the church of Hereford.

Richard Barbour agreed with this statement, and said that it grieved him to find the fish in the chamber of William the monk, and that he had taken away the dagger because it did not belong to the monk, but to a certain John Wodyer of the town of Hereford, which the latter had lost a few days previously in a street in Hereford, and which Richard had returned to him. But John Orchard, contrary to Richard's bidding, had taken away the bow and arrows. Richard then submitted himself to the archbishop's judgment, and sought pardon for his act. The archbishop caused him to swear obedience to the church and to promise to do such penance as the archbishop should enjoin. above-mentioned canons however requested of the archbishop that he would impose no penance upon the said Richard other than the return of the dagger, and bow, and arrows. the said Richard promised to return on the next Whit-Sunday or on another holy day.
