## NEWBURY COUNTY GIRLS' GRAMMAR SCHOOL

[Newbury County Girls' School was established in 1904 as a secondary school and pupil-teacher centre in the old Technical Institute building. It moved to new premises in Andover Road, Newbury, in 1910. In 1945 it became Newbury County Girls' Grammar School.

It was amalgamated in 1975 with St Bartholomew's Grammar School (for boys) to form a mixed comprehensive school, St Bartholomew's School, in the Andover Road premises.

The School Council or Cabinet was an elected pupil organisation, established in 1919. It comprised all members of the Sixth Form, with elected representatives from other forms and from the "Groups" (similar to houses in other schools). The Council monitored pupil behaviour and decided on many school rules, including the uniform. It elected officials, including prefects, head girl and games captain, and organised charity collections.]
