Appleby's ENCYCLOPAEDIA OF THE WORLD'S AIRCRAFT: a purchased collection on flying history containing thousands of mounted newspaper cuttings and extracts from journals, photographs, pamphlets, trade literature etc.

Assembled over the period c1910-c1960 by William E Appleby, this unique collection is virtually an encyclopaedia of the history of flight. It was auctioned after his retirement in 1971.

Appleby, as a boy, worked at the Gosforth Aircraft Works of Armstrong-Whitworth. Later he rented the hangar at Cramlington Airship Station to carry out the manufacture of model aircraft kits. In later life the company of which he was a director, Tubular Barriers Ltd, was responsible for grandstands and crowd barriers at many air shows.
