Collection of Geoffrey C Berry, (1914-1983)

Geoffrey C Berry was born in 1914. He took an MA degree at Oxford as Barrister-at-law and was employed by the Metropolitan Water Board (MWB) in the Clerk's Registry, the General Purposes Committee and the Statistical Section. In 1951 he was appointed Research Assistant, Statistical Section and later acted as archivist to the Board. In these roles Berry compiled much of the information which now forms the collection. He died in 1983. The collection consists of manuscripts and typescript notes on the history of water supply in the London area compiled by Berry from the MWB records, the Public Record Office, the City Record Office and the British Library. Berry's collection of printed books on the history and engineering of water supply was transferred to the Science Museum Library's book stock.
