CONTEXT

Administrative/Biographical history: Rice Mansel Dillwyn was the third son of John Cole Nicholl and Mary de la Beche Dillwyn (eldest daughter of Lewis Llewelyn Dillwyn of Hendrefoilan). He was born in 1875, and married Harriet (eldest daughter of Arthur Gilbertson of Glanrhyd). Assumed the Surname of Dillwyn. He worked as a mining engineer, in partnership with J. D. Jones.

CONTENT

Scope and content/abstract: Records of Dillwyn and Jones Mining Engineers, [c. 1890]-1945, including: plans of collieries, mineral estates, estates, and steel and tinplate works; and geological plans, Ordnance Survey plans, notebooks, dialling books, and reports. Also correspondence, notebooks, papers, and photographs of R. M. Dillwyn, 1891-1919.
