# Administrative/biographical history

In 1904, the Congregational Union of England and Wales held its autumnal meeting in Cardiff. A committee of representatives from local churches was formed in order to prepare for this meeting. After the meeting had been held, it was decided that it would be useful to establish a similar organisation to represent the churches in the area.

This led to the creation of the Cardiff and District Congregational Council, made up of local ministers and delegates elected by local churches. The Council held regular meetings on a quarterly basis. Its purpose was to consider the needs of its associated churches and to offer advice required. It also organised united services and events, and a lecture series in local churches, with the aim of bringing members of associated churches together.

Initially, it was also hoped that a separate Welsh branch would be established, which would operate separately, but join the English branch for joint annual meetings.

In 1914, serious consideration was given to the state of congregationalism in the Cardiff area. The Cardiff and District Congregational Council asked for the opinion of laymen on the matter. This led to the creation of the Cardiff and District Laymen's Fraternal. It held its inaugural meeting on 2 July 1915, when it decided to establish a committee comprising two members from each church to consider this issue. The committee held quarterly conferences to discuss problems facing congregationalism in Cardiff. Suggestions made at conference were then offered to the Committee for consideration, and if approved placed before the churches for further consideration and adoption.

The first conference was held at Charles Street Congregational Church on 15 October 1915. The idea of establishing a fund to assist needy churches and support work in the area was discussed. This was approved at subsequent meetings. The fund would be administered by the Executive of the Cardiff and District Congregational Council, assisted by seven laymen appointed by the Fraternal. The scheme was given final approval on 7 April 1916, and its administrative body was named the Cardiff and District Congregational Board.

The Cardiff and District Congregational Board held its first meeting on 17 April 1916 at Charles Street Congregational Church, under the chairmanship of Revd. R. E. Salmon. Its initial aim was the collection of £5000 to £10,000 over its first three years of operation. This money would be used to extinguish existing debts on churches in the area; to obtain and purchase sites for the building of churches, and to assist with the extension or rebuilding of existing premises, and to provide grants towards the salaries of ministers engaged by associated churches. Only churches affiliated to the Cardiff and District Congregational Council were eligible to apply to the fund. By the time the Board held its first annual meeting on 21 March 1917, £3500 had been raised.

On 21 September 1917, the Council and the Board amalgamated to form a sole body name the Cardiff and District Congregational Board. It hoped to acquire the former Raper's Hotel on Westgate Street, adjacent to the Wood Street Congregational Church, as its headquarters. This building would then be used to house offices, a library, a Sunday School equipment room, meeting rooms, rooms for the use of the rapidly expanding Wood Street Church, and a hostel for young ladies new to Cardiff. Unfortunately, due to the war, the premises were transformed into the headquarters of the Food Control Committee. Luckily, the Board managed to acquire the adjacent premises at 10 and 12 Westgate Street. Finally, on 19 January 1920, it moved in to the former Raper's Hotel, renamed Church House.

In 1918, the Board was incorporated, and in 1919 it began producing its monthly periodical, *The Congregational Magazine*.

#### Scope and content

The records comprise minutes and committee papers; financial papers; papers relating to Board property; legal documents; copies of, and papers concerning Board publications, and general administrative papers.
