## CONTEXT

Administrative/Biographical history: The Captain Scott Society was founded in 1983, following a dinner given to celebrate the anniversary of a dinner given by members of the commercial community of Cardiff, Glamorgan, to Captain Scott, his officers and scientists of the British Antarctic Expedition (including Wilfrid Bruce), prior to their departure south on the 15th June, 1910. The aims of the society were threefold: firstly, to commemorate the departure of Captain Scott and the expedition on an annual basis; secondly, to further the spirit of adventure by making an award of £1,000 raised by membership subscription; and thirdly to support a charity in keeping with the Society's military and naval foundation. In 1990, the society published *The Spirit of Adventure* to commerate the 80th anniversary of the expedition's departure from Cardiff.
