CONTEXT

Administrative/Biographical history: Turnpiking of stretches of highway from 1663 until the 1840s was an attempt to force the road user rather than the local inhabitant to bear the chief cost of road improvement and maintainance. In the 18th century the levying of tolls on roads became common practice and trusts were established by Acts of Parliament. However, the practice of turnpiking was not popular and the tollgate became a public annoyance as transport networks developed and grew over the late 18th and early 19th centuries. The turnpikes of South Wales were abolished under an Act in 1844 and the roads were handed over to country road boards.
