## CONTEXT

**Administrative/Biographical history:** The Corbetts were a leading Glamorganshire family. John Stuart Corbett (b.1816) was a J.P. and the son of the Venerable Archdeacon Stuart Corbett of York. The family residence was Cogan Pill, near Cardiff, a mansion built by the Herbert family c1550. In 1793 Cogan Pill was purchased by the Earl of Bute.

Rees family of Sully House, c1871; game books, accounts and lists of game killed at Leckwith, Cogan and elsewhere, 1862-1951; photographs of ecclesiastical subjects, c1865-1944.
