Administrative/Biographical history

Grangetown Elementary School was opened in 1884 by Cardiff School Board to 'fill the gaps' in the educational service provided by Clive Street National School and St Patrick's Roman Catholic School (in Higher Grangetown). At opening, the total number of children in the Infants, Boys and Girls departments was nearly 500 but numbers increased rapidly with the extension of docks facilities around Cardiff Bay reaching 932 by 1900. Many pupils were transferred to the newly opened Virgil Street School from 1901 in order to reduce pressure on Grangetown in response to a report by the Board of Education. In 1950 - in accordance with the Education Act 1944 - the boys and girls departments for children aged up to 11 were combined to form Grangetown Junior Mixed School: older boys were transferred to Ninian Park Secondary Modern School while the senior girls remained on the Grangetown site to form Grangetown Secondary Modern School. These were transferred to Fitzalan High School in 1968. The rearrangements resulted in a gradual fall in the number of pupils to 530 in 1974. All records offered have been accepted and listed. Two admissions registers for Ninian Park School (reference EC42) and Virgil Street School (EC43) were found among the deposit and have been listed separately. The Girls Department log-book 1900-1912 was deposited in May 2004 by Fitzalan High School, Cardiff.

Conditions governing access

Access to log-books is 30 years and 75 years for admissions registers and punishment books.
