# NG33 Sir Martin Davies' Papers 1939-1975

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Council for Places of Worship

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### **BIOGRAPHICAL HISTORY:**

Martin Davies (MD) was born in Cheyne Walk, London on 22 March 1908, the younger son of Ernest Woodbine Davies and Elizabeth Eleanor Davies. He attended Rugby School and went up to Cambridge in 1926 where he studied Mathematics and Modern Languages.

He joined the National Gallery (NG) as an honorary attache in October 1930 and became part of the institution's permanent staff on 1 January 1932 as an Assistant Keeper.

During the Second World War he played an essential role in protecting the NG pictures and was effectively in charge of their safe storage at Manod Quarry in North Wales. MD's war time duties provided him with an exceptional opportunity for close study of the NG pictures and he began work on a series of catalogues which became renowned for their new approach to the study of pictures (where possible MD referred to original source material).

In 1947 he became Deputy Keeper of the NG and in 1960 (on the death of William Pettigrew Gibson) he became Keeper. On 1 January 1968 he became Director: a post he held until his retirement on 30 September 1973.

MD never married. He devoted his life to the NG and other related causes. His social life - at least in later years - centred on the Reform Club, where he dined almost every evening. He was appointed CBE in 1965 and knighted in 1972.

MD died of cancer in a London Hospital on 7 March 1975.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

The MD papers concern six different areas of his life: his gallery activities during wartime; his work on a variety of publications; his work with the Courtauld Institute; the Museums Association; the Council for Places of Worship and with the Reform Club. The main bulk of the papers concern MD in his official role with each institution: there are no personal or family papers.

#### **CUSTODIAL HISTORY:**

The MD papers were collected together by MD on his retirement in 1973. They were later transferred to NG Archive (exact date unknown).

#### **ARRANGEMENT:**

The papers have been arranged into sub-groups each representing a different area of MD's life. They have been maintained (as far as possible) according to their original order.

### **DIPLOMATIC DESCRIPTION:**

The papers include mostly correspondence and drafts of publications. There are also catalogues, minutes and photographic prints.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

During the Second World War most of the pictures were removed from the NG and taken to places of safe storage.

On 1 September 1939, the first consignment was taken in specially prepared railway coaches to North Wales, and from here to various locations: National Library, Aberystwyth; Avening; Pritchard Jones Hall, Bangor; Bontnewydd; Caernarvon Castle; Crosswood; and Penryn Castle.

The fall of France in 1940 brought greater risk of bombing and it was decided that the safest storage for NG pictures was underground. Manod Quarry - a remote disused slate quarry near Blaenau Ffestiniog - was chosen and on 12 August 1941 the first NG pictures were removed from their overground deposits and delivered at Manod. MD (with the help of 13 NG staff) lived at nearby Pengwern House and was effectively in charge of the project. His NG colleague, Ian Rawlins, acted as the scientific advisor. Manod Quarry also sheltered the NG library which MD used constantly whilst researching and writing his catalogues.

The pictures remained at Manod for the duration of the War. Some weeks before the cessation of the hostilities in Europe, a few pictures were selected (by Kenneth Clark, then Director) to be sent back to Trafalgar Square. By the end of 1945 everything had returned from Wales.

### **CUSTODIAL HISTORY:**

The wartime papers were collected and compiled by MD on his retirement (see NG33/10: MD's introduction and index to the papers). They were later transferred to the Archive. Five of the six catalogues were kept separately in the Archive but were added to the papers during cataloguing in February 1999. Although deposited by the Conservation Department in 1995, it became clear they were originally MD provenance.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

Inventories, annotated catalogues and correspondence relating to the location and storage conditions of NG pictures during the War. The papers also contain similar details relating to pictures not owned by the NG.

### **ARRANGEMENT:**

Records maintained (as far as possible) according to the order detailed in MD's index and list of 1973. The catalogues have been arranged chronologically according to the annotations within them.

1940-1941

File containing manuscript and typescript inventories (some with annotations) recording the location of individual National Gallery pictures at different dates during the war. The inventories appear to have been used as checklists and record the despatch and arrival of the pictures at different Welsh locations.

Includes inventories of pictures at: National Library, Aberystwyth; Avening; Pritchard Jones Hall, Bangor; Bontnewydd; Caernarvon Castle; Crosswood; Manod Quarry and Penryn Castle.

The pictures are listed by NG number and by artist (occasionally they may also include the picture title).

### NG33/3 Wartime Storage: Non-National Gallery Pictures 1 File

File containing correspondence and other papers (typescript and manuscript) concerning the transfer and deposit of pictures not owned by the National Gallery to various locations in Wales.

In his index MD states that the records in this file are incomplete and that details of certain pictures are not included. [File formerly known as Pictures Deposited by Other Owners, numbers 3a-3m in MD's index]

Letter relating to a request by King George VI for two items stored at Manod Quarry (a parchment indenture between Princess Margaret and J.M. Barrie; and Princess Elizabeth's account of the coronation) to be returned to Windsor, photographed and then used for propaganda in Latin America.

.3 Fifteen letters, three inventories and four notes concerning works of art from the collections of Viscount Bearsted; the Hunterian Museum, Glasgow; Misses Gwendoline Elizabeth and Margaret Sidney Davies; Louis Clarke (Director, Fitzwilliam Museum); the Courtauld Institute; the Gulbenkian collection; Miss Mollie Sands; and Bridgewater House.

Typescript list of wartime storage papers compiled by MD dated 16 August 1973. With introductory note.

At the time of cataloguing (February 1999), item (4a) was not found among the papers. (3k) is not a separate item: it is part of the list of the Gulbenkian collection (3j).

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

Throughout his life MD devoted a great deal of time towards research for a number of publications.

Between 1945 and 1974 he had published 15 catalogues, books and pamphlets as well as numerous other articles. His first work - a catalogue concerned with the NG pictures of the Early Netherlandish School - received great acclaim and was responsible for developing a new critical approach to the study of pictures. He wrote with the assumption that the author was duty bound not merely to provide all the information but to draw, with due caution, any conclusions he could.

Throughout his life he worked on a number of solo and joint ventures producing books, articles, monographs and reviews. Amongst others he published *Les Primitifs Flamands - The National Gallery, London,* Vol I, 1953, Vol II, 1954, Vol III, 1970; *Les Primitifs Flamands - The National Gallery of Victoria, Melbourne* (with Ursula Hoff), 1971 and *European Pictures in the Collection of the Worcester Art Museum* (Italian School 1974).

When MD died in 1975 he was working on two unfinished monographs.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

Includes correspondence, research notes and draft copies concerning Les Primitifs Flamands Anonymes (catalogue for exhibition at Brugges), 1969; Les Primitifs Flamands, The National Gallery, London Vol III, 1970; Les Primitifs Flamands, The National Gallery Victoria, Melbourne, 1971; European Pictures in the Collection of the Worcester Art Museum (Italian School section), 1974. Also includes early work on two unpublished texts: Hugo van der Goes and Fra Lippo Lippi.

#### ARRANGEMENT:

The publication papers have been arranged, where possible, according to original order. In particular, an attempt has been made (by reference to accompanying correspondence and published copies) to arrange the drafts in chronological order.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

In the early 1960s MD was approached by Worcester Art Museum, Massachusetts (WAM) to write a catalogue of the Italian pictures in the WAM collection. In 1964 WAM received funding to produce a wider catalogue of all the European pictures in the museum. MD was to continue writing the section on Italian pictures and other authors were assigned to write separate sections relating to different schools of painting. Although MD's papers reveal that he worked on his section until the mid 1960s, the book *European Pictures in the Collection of the Worcester Art Museum* (EPWAM) was not finally published until 1974.

A note in the introduction to the publication *European Pictures in the Collection of the Worcester Art Museum* by Louisa Dresser, states that "due to editorial and production delays a considerable length of time elapsed between the completion of the manuscripts and the publications of the text." It also records that MD completed the Italian entries by the end of 1965, that he attempted to keep them up to date but that very few amendments were made after 1968.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

In the early 1960s, MD was approached to act as an advisor on an updated translation of Friedlander's *Early Netherlandish Pictures* (ENP). There are 14 volumes of ENP (each concerning various painters), which were published gradually between 1967-1977. MD continued to work in his advisory capacity to the translator (Heinz Norden) until his retirement in 1973.

As these became outdated MD began work on a third volume which was intended as a supplement to the previous two. This was published in 1970.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

Between the early 1960s and 1970 MD was approached by the National Gallery of Victoria, Melbourne to help write a further addition to the *Les Primitifs Flamands* volumes. This was concerned with four pictures in the National Gallery of Victoria in Melbourne. Responsibility for the publication was divided between Ursula Hoff, Curator of the National Gallery, Melbourne (who had sole responsibility for Van Eyck, The Madonna with Child) and MD, who acted as co-author for the other three pictures. Some of the entries were also contributed to an exhibition catalogue for Brugges Groeningsmuseum in 1969 (see NG33/30). The book *Les Primitifs Flamands, Melbourne* was published in 1971.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

In 1969 MD was asked to contribute to a catalogue that was being prepared for an exhibition of Anonymous Flemish Primitives, held at the Groeningemuseum in Brugge from 12 June - 21 September 1969. MD advised and corrected entries on four specific pictures: Workshop of the Master of 1518 The Crucifixion [NG718]; Master of Brugges Passion Scenes Christ presented to the People [NG1087]; Workshop of the Master of the Magdalen Legend The Magdalen [NG2614] and Netherlandish Acts of Charity [NG4573]. At the time MD was also working on a book (Les Primitifs Flamands, Melbourne with Ursula Hoff of the National Gallery Victoria, Melbourne) and was able to contribute other entries that he had prepared for this publication.

### NG33/30 PFA: Brugges Exhibition Papers 1 File

Following the success of his monograph on Rogier van der Weyden published in 1972, MD began work on a similar project concerning the painter Hugo van der Goes. He continued to work (if somewhat sporadically) on the project until his death in 1975. The van der Goes monograph was never published.

After his retirement from the National Gallery in 1973, MD was able to devote almost all his time towards the project. He continued to work on the monograph until his death in 1975. The Lippo Lippi monograph was never published.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

The Courtauld Institute was founded in 1932. It was constituted as a Department of London University and its function was the teaching of Art history at undergraduate and graduate level and the general encouragement of interest in fine arts.

By the late 1960s the Institute was experiencing acute problems with space. The Friends of the Institute were formed by Anthony Blunt in September 1969 in an attempt to raise money to help solve the problems relating to lack of space and to raise the profile of the Institute generally.

At it's inception in 1969, MD agreed to sit on the Committee. He remained on the Committee until his death in 1975 when he was replaced by Michael Levey.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT:

Includes correspondence, committee minutes, annual reports and lists of members (mainly relating to the inception and early activities of the Friends).

#### ARRANGEMENT:

The files are arranged by diplomatic form.

### NG33/34 Friends of the Courtauld Institute: Correspondence 1969-1973

File containing correspondence mostly between MD and the Friends of the Courtauld Insitute concerning arrangements for meetings and official duties.

Also includes correspondence concerning the original establishment of the Friends; a copy of the Memorandum and Articles of Association (incorporated 20 November 1969) and a note from Stephenson Harwood and Tatham explaining the Society's Articles (December 1969).

### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

In the 1950s, the Council for Places of Worship (under its' former name the Council for the Care of Churches) together with the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings set up a Wallpaintings Committee to advise upon and encourage, the proper care of wall-paintings in English churches. In response to requests from other bodies a General Conservation Committee - with an extended membership and function - was formed in 1969 to co-ordinate advice on the care and conservation of important church furnishings and fittings of all kinds.

MD was asked, and agreed to join the Committee in November 1972. He remained a member until at least November 1973 (exact date unknown).

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

The Reform Club, situated at 104-105 Pall Mall SW1, was founded in 1832 by the Radicals and Whigs after the Reform Bill of the same year.

It was established in 1836 in a building designed by the architect Sir Charles Barry, but eventually constructed on a larger scale, on the site which had housed the NG from 1824-1824 (then a private house of the banker John Julius Angerstein who had donated the first 38 pictures to the NG).

Initially it's membership was political but by the Nineteenth Century it had become more of a social club. MD was a member for most of his life and in 1971, he was approached to join a Working Party for the renovation of the Club's Lighting.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

Includes correspondence, minutes, proposals and plans of the Club's Working Party Lighting Committee of which MD was a member.
