

## **CECIL SHARP CORRESPONDENCE COLLECTION**

### Introduction

Throughout these notes and indexes, the following abbreviations are used:

CS = Cecil Sharp

MK = Maud Karpeles

AFS = A.H. Fox Strangways

The material in this collection is of a very miscellaneous nature. It was apparently amassed by AFS and MK in and about 1931 when they were engaged in writing Sharp's biography, which was published in 1933.

The collection includes:

1. Original letters written by CS and presumably donated by the recipients in response to the published appeals for such material by MK and AFS
2. Copies of letters from CS made at the time of writing
3. Extracts of letters from CS made either by the recipients or by MK
4. Originals of letters written to CS during his lifetime
5. Letters to AFS and MK, usually containing material about CS
6. Typescripts and MS rough drafts of articles by CS
7. Cuttings, leaflets, pamphlets, etc., relevant to CS's work, or concerning organisations with which he was involved
8. Correspondence which has been acquired (sometimes in photocopy) since MK's time

The material was originally sorted by MK into seven box files:

- 1-3 contain miscellaneous material in alphabetical order of correspondent
- 4-7 are sub-divided into manilla folders by rough subject area. The manilla folders have been assigned letters to facilitate identification: thus 7F = folder F in box 7. The subject classification in these boxes parallels the organisation of parts of the finished biography. Within each folder, arrangement is roughly alphabetical by name of correspondent, and then chronological.

See below for a more detailed list of boxes and folders.

In the majority of cases, individual items have been left where MK classified them, although occasionally major anomalies have been re-sorted. Sequences of letters from the same correspondent have sometimes been re-arranged to regularise the chronological order.

NOTE: The subject arrangement means that letters to and from particular individuals may be filed in several places. Always use the NAME INDEX to locate material pertaining to particular individuals.
