# A. Work as General Practitioner 1947 1977

# **Summary**

Byrne practised as general practitioner in Milnthorpe, Westmorland, from 1936 to 1968, when the Department of General Practice, of which he was Director, was established. This involved leaving his Milnthorpe practice for Darbishire House Teaching Health Centre, where he was one of the general practitioners, although his heavy commitments to teaching and to the Royal College of General Practitioners limited his time spent seeing patients. Contains series of diaries, administrative notes and correspondence, including accounts, and instruments. # **B.** Department of General Practice Manchester University 1960 1978

# Summary

Material relating to Byrne's work setting up and running the Department of General Practice in 1968. The Department was one of the first University Departments of General Practice, and Byrne used the Department, evaluating the work of the Department as a research exercise, to promote the establishment of other such Departments in other institutions across the College. His work at Manchester began with a part-time lectureship to teach undergraduates about general practice at the Manchester University Medical School in 1965. In 1966 he became half-time Senior Lecturer and member of the Steering Committee to establish the Department of General Practice. He then became the first Chair of General Practice in 1972. He held this post until retiring and being made Emeritus Professor in 1978. Contains series of desk diaries, lecture notes and related correspondence, published work and related notes and correspondence, administrative papers, and letters received at the time of his promotion to Chair in 1972 and at his retirement, 1978.

# B1. Diaries, 1966 - 1980

The diaries cover all aspects of Byrne's life, reflecting his commitments not only to the Department of General Practice at Manchester University, but also to the Royal College of General Practitioners, see *B BYR C*, the various committees and working parties on which he sat, and the visits he made abroad, see B *BYR D*. Although they cover several aspects of his life outside of his work at Manchester, the series encompasses the years that Byrne worked at the University, 1965-1978, his other commitments lasting for shorter timescales within the period. They show how he divided his time between his many commitments. The placing of the diaries within the papers relating to Manchester University acknowledges that his biggest commitment was to, and ultimately his income was derived from, Manchester.

# **B2.** Establishing the Department of General Practice, 1964 - 1970

Material which relates to the setting up of the Department of General Practice at Manchester University. In 1968 general practice became a sub-department within the Department of Medicine, with three senior lecturers, Byrne, Dr H.W.K. Acheson and Dr H.J. Wright, and one lecturer, Dr R.H. Wilkins, and in 1969 the Department of General Practice became an independent department within the Faculty of Medicine with Byrne as Director. Series includes correspondence, letters of appointment, Byrne's notes about the preparations for the establishment of the Department, and documents prepared for the relevant bodies outlining the proposals for the new Department.

# **B BYR B 2 1 Planning the Department of General Practice 1964-1965**

Documents are typed, often with handwritten annotations;

(iii) Application to the Nuffield Provincial Hospitals Trust for funding of the Department, applying specifically for funds to provide new medical and secretarial staff to strengthen the emerging Department and to go towards a new teaching health centre (2 copies);

(iv) Documents elaborating on the remit of the proposed Department, its scope and aims, and the projects to be undertaken. Papers created to be circulated within the University, to the Vice Chancellor, the General Practice Steering Committee, Professor Campbell, Dr F.B. Beswick, Metcalfe Brown, Professor Kellgren, Dr McWhinney, Alwyn Smith, including a breakdown of the teaching areas and methods, a scheme for payment of General Practitioners at the University Teaching Centre, staffing requirements, vocational training, postgraduate vocational training, December 1966 - 1 October 1970;

(v) Working papers relating to the development of Darbishire House as a General Practice Teaching Unit, and the possibility of a teaching health centre based on a district general hospital, circulated within the University to the Senate, O'Leesky, Anscombe, A.B. Scott, and G. Smith [these maybe members of the Senate, or of the Faculty of Medicine within the University], August - 18 October 1967. Also includes later paper on the proposed alterations to Darbishire House, sent to Mr S. Smith, 23 October 1968

# BBYR E 7 1 Byrne's Filing System 1994

Copies of Byrne's filing system, used throughout his professional career, with related correspondence *[Lists appear to have been typed subsequently, by his widow, Dr Kathleen Pearson?]* For each numbered entry there is usually a date, title of the paper, and list of the recipients (Journal, if an article; audience, if a lecture; name of colleague(s), if a memorandum, letter, or working document).

Papers throughout the collection are numbered and correspond to the entries on these lists. The papers were arranged chronologically and refer to all aspects of Byrne's work, at Manchester University, Department of General Practice, B BYR B, the Royal College of General Practitioners, B BYR C, and to his other commitments, at home and abroad, B BYR D. As an original finding aid they offer information about the papers that is not always obtainable from the content of the papers themselves, and give an insight into the way Byrne worked;
