1	1877-1881	<p>Official journal of P.C. 116, Dorset Constabulary, Solomon Dennett.</p> <p>Mr. Dennett was based on the station at Compton (where he started the journal) until May, 1878, when he moved to Tetminster Police Station.</p> <p>Columns for dates and times, conferences with other policemen, residences or farms visited or patrolled, state of weather, remarks, number of miles travelled. Record of serving summonses, giving evidence at Petty Sessions, apprehending and escorting prisoners, inspecting inns, receiving information, doing duty at fairs, clubs, shows.</p> <p>1879, February, records beings stabbed and giving evidence against his assailant.</p> <p>1880, November, - January, 1881. On special duty at Yeovil Junction watching arrival and departure of trains.</p>	1 vol.
2	1964	<p>Letter from Mr. Dennett's son (donor of the journal) giving information about his father's life.</p> <p><u>Note:</u> Some extracts from the journal were published in the Year Book of the Society of Dorset Men, 1957-8, page 43.</p>	1
3	1917-1919	<p>Official journal of S. Dennett as a Special Constable, in Maiden Newton area. (Lived at Cattistock). Usual duties; also delivering and collecting "Live Stock" and "Horse Census" forms, making enquiries about escapes from Prisoner of War Camps, asylums, Boy's Homes. Reports forced landings of aeroplanes in his area.</p>	1 vol.
