After dispute between Benedict, Abbot of Abbotsbury (1297-1320), and Robert, Abbot of Middelton (1314-1331), about bounds between their lands on hill called Heltonysdown next Chalfcombe, agreement reached and bounds laid down, Sunday before Feast of St Thomas the Apostle 1319 (16 December).</p> <p>Agreement between John, Abbot of Abbotysbury [Abbotsbury] (1257-1284) and William, Abbot of Middelton (1256-1273) about land on hill on west of valley and arable called Develscombe [? Delcombe]. No date</p> <p>Metes and bounds between lordships of Lusshcombe [Lyscombe] in Cheselborne and Melcombe [Melcombe Horsey]. [Probably unfinished].</p> <p>Boundaries and limits of Oure [Ower] at Fromemouth in Purbyk [Purbeck], with common bounds in the royal land called Hethfeld, anciently appropriated to fee farm, and bounds of royal free tenement called Voxysplace. No date.</p> <p>Memorandum of tithes belonging to office of Prior of Middelton in Mylborn Andree [Milborne St. Andrew]. No date.</p> <p>Charter of John de Muleborn concerning gift of tithes in Muleborn. No date.</p> <p>Charter of gift of foundation of tithe barn in Muleborn. No date.</p> <p>In Hundred Court of Corfe Castle: exoneration of Abbot from paying 2s. rent for Chapel of St. Elene in Purbyk, 25 Oct. 10 Henry IV.</p> <p>Inquisition taken at Poole concerning tithes of Chapel of St. Helene in Purbyk from two islands called St. Helenyslond. After dispute between Rector of Corfe Castle and Abbot, verdict that tithes always belonged to Abbey of Middelton, 11 September.</p> <p>Westhemelisworth [West Hemsforth in Witchampton]. Customary made by Nicholas Langford in first court held by him after death of Edmund Strode, 2 June.</p> <p>First entry or possession of Walter Archer, Abbot of Middelton, and first court of manor of Bedyshurst [Bedchester in Fontmell Magna] held by Nicholas Langford on Day of St. Dunstan, 18 Richard II. 19 May.</p>	1

	1264	Assignment of manors of Okeford <u>[Fitzpaine]</u> and Dundyssh <u>[Duntish]</u> with advowsons of churches to Joan, widow of Alured, as dowry, 10 July 48 Henry III.	
	1264	Royal grant to Robert Fitzpayne, one of the heirs, of manor of Wynterborn with advowson of church; Knight's fees in Corfton <u>[Corton in Portesham]</u> , Boukeland <u>[Buckland]</u> , Pudell Bardalf <u>[Piddle Bardolph in Puddletown]</u> , 1/5 part of Knight's fee in Tatton <u>[? in Portesham]</u> , 1/2 Knight's fee in Lyme, 11 July 48 Henry III.
