

POOR LAW RECORDS: PARISH OF PORTSMOUTH

Overseers' Accounts

Four Overseers were appointed. A variable number of rates were raised each year and it appears that it was usual for each overseer, in turn, to administer expenditure under one rate: AB - 1st rate, CD - 2nd rate, EF - 3rd rate, GH - 4th rate, AB - 5th rate and so in rotation. From 1750 the accounts follow this order each year. Before that date the accounts for each overseer for the several periods during the year for which he was responsible are grouped together.

Journals (variously titled on covers and spine): daily occurence books for the Workhouse containing chiefly notes of admissions and discharges and of daily total of persons in the House.

- PLIO Volume containing roughly written accounts relating to the poor 1815 29; at other end, a few pages of accounts 1825 26 struck through, a list of persons in the House n.d. and list of 5 persons sent to Winchester Hospital 1817.
- PLIL Volume inscribed on cover 'Examination of Paupers in and out of the House' containing alphabetical lists of persons in receipt of permanent weekly or casual relief with particulars of age, family circumstances, grounds of settlement etc., and lists of persons in the House giving age, date of admission, discharge, employment etc., 1826 36.

Day Books: daily record of food and other goods purchased for the Workhouse with name of suppliers and prices.
