Would be pleased if the branch of the Atwood family referred to in John Robinson, The Atwood Family with Historic Notes and Pedigrees (Sunderland, 1903) were connected with his own branch, which claims a saxon origin. Eccloses [presumably] DD/375/37/2, a tracing from a rough copy of a water colour of his grandfather's house in Hammersmith, which now belongs to his cousin Mrs. Arnold Toynbee, 16 Norham Gdns., Oxford, the daughter of his father's brother William Duncombe Atwood who was born in the house. The house was pulled down when the first suspension bridge was built. Mr. Martin at the Library was unable to find any mention of the house or its demolition. Would be pleased if some street or property in Hammersmith were to be named after the Atwoods. Possibly land on the west side of Beavor Lane which he used to own would be suitable for this.

The items listed below are stamped 'with the compliments of Sir Villiam Bull' but have been firmly 'entrenched' in the Hammersmith Local Collection for some time and are in regular use as parts of series, the remainder of which have been accumulated from other sources, It is not now practicable or advisable to relocate these items and store them with the material which appears carlier in this list, and DD/375 numbers have not been assigned to them. They are listed below in the interests of completeness. The registers of electors are classified at H324.24 HAM. All apart from the first undated one are printed and most if not all those for the years 1694 - 1919 were used by WJB during political campaigns and contain varying degrees of HS notation. Where the initials 'HGCA' appear below the registers referred to are inscribed on the front endpaper as belonging to the Hammersmith Conservative and Constitutional Association, and often contain a considerable amount of detailed annotation and amendment concerned with elections. All the newspapers are bound together with various other papers from other sources, and are classified at HO70 HAM.
