Walthamstow School Board: minutes, accounts, letterbooks and other papers

Introduction

As a result of the Education Act of 1870, Walthamstow parishioners formed a Local Committee under the auspices of the West Ham Union School Attendance Committee in 1876. This however proved unsatisfactory to the Education Department, and in 1880 a School Board was compulsorily formed. This then administered elementary schools formerly National or British schools until the Education Act of 1902 dissolved the Board and Walthamstow became a Part III Authority for elementary education.

HC 1 - 6 . This series begins as the continuation volume of HC 1 above. It includes the early minutes of individual school committees: Marsh Street, Haynard Road and also the early minutes of the School Management Committee, Works Committee and special committees, including the whole Board sitting as a committee. HC 2 contains rough Board minutes and the first minutes of the Finance Committee. This format is then retained through the 1890s. The volume for 1891 includes the newly formed Technical Instruction Committee and Evening Class Committee. HC6 continued in use under the Education Committee.

DC 1 - 3 District Committees. In 1895 the Board established two district committees. District Committee 1 covered Marsh Street, Preteoria Avenue, Higham Hill, Chapel End, Hale End, Blackhorse Road, Forest Road, the Technical School and a 'Temporary School'. District Committee 2 covered Markhouse Road, Gamuel Road, South Grove, Haynard Road, Shernhall Street, Wood Street and Boundary Road schools. Both committees would appear to have been dissolved in April 1901, and April 1900 respectively.
