Walthamstow Burial Board was formed in 1870 and, after searching for a suitable site, purchased land adjoining Queen's Road, and opened the cemetary in 1872. As with many other local government institutions of the time in Walthamstow, the Board appointed William Houghton, a local solicitor as clerk. The Board ran the cemetary until its functions were assumed by the Walthamstow UDC in 1896.
