The Commission's attention was initially drawn to the holdings of New College by Sir James Pergusson of Kilkerran, Bt., LL.D., who had consulted them in the course of private research. With the agreement of the Board of Governors, listing commenced in March 1965, fairly regular visits being made by Messrs. A. S. Bell and R. A. Storey and latterly Miss E. C. Bush, of the Commission's staff, for some two years thereafter.

New College, London is a Divinity School of the University of London, primarily for the training of men and women for the Congregational ministry. It is the product of a number of amalgamations of existing institutions, principally of Homerton, Coward and Nighbury Colleges in 1850 (from which New College was created), and of Hackney and New Colleges in 1924. By the courtesy of the Rev. G. F. Nuttall, M.A., D.D., Librarian of New College, a chart follows this Introduction, showing the principal Congregational Academies and Colleges, from which both the constitutents of New College and also other bodies featuring in its records can be identified.

No attempt will be made in this Introduction to deal with the complex and interesting history of New College and its predecessors, but certain features of its archival holdings should be pointed out. As may be expected, a considerable proportion of these relates to the administration of the various institutions, including minutes of governing bodies and committees, accounts and related correspondence. These papers include applications from intending students, which in many cases give considerable detail on the life of the applicants and thus have genealogical significance, as well as relevance for any sociological study of the Congregational ministry, especially in the first half of the nineteenth century. This institutional material also throws light on the curricula and educational policy of a number of institutions in the same period.

The Colleges had in some cases extensive buildings and property and their surviving records contain some material of architectural, building and topographical interest. Further local material is contained in the correspondence relating to 'the care of the churches' - the support and counselling of local congregations by such men as Philip Doddridge and Thomas Wilson. Many of these letters give detailed information on the religious life and social conditions of villages and towns in areas ranging from South Devon to the Midlands and North of England.

The significance of Doddridge in the history of Nonconformity is well-known and the Doddridge personal and family papers are undoubtedly the most important part of New College's holdings. In addition to Doddridge, Thomas Wilson, Dr. Samuel Newth, Rev. Thomas Binney and Dr. John Pye Smith are included amongst the staff or officers of the numerous predecessors of the present New College who are of sufficient importance to warrant an entry in the Dictionary of National Biography. A considerable number of other ministers who feature in the correspondence and papers preserved at New College are also of D.N.B. status, and are so indicated in the Index.

There are isolated documents emanating from or relating to overseas countries, notably a few of Binney's letters from Australia and Rev. R. Morrison's from and about China. In addition, the students' registers in some cases contain details of the subsequent careers of students who took up missionary or other posts overseas, but no details other than title and covering dates are generally given of these or other volumes in this list.

The list which follows is divided into three parts on a mixed basis of format, subject and location. - The main numerical sequence is of administrative records and some collected material preserved in the strongroom of New College. The second main series is of what have been loosely termed 'literary MSS.', distinguished by the prefix 'L' in the list. These include sermons, grangerised volumes, mounted correspondence, essays, lecture notes and miscellaneous papers. Some are kept in the Librarian's Room or in show-cases in the Library, but the bulk is in the strong-room. The distinction between these two groups has in some cases been made largely on the grounds of convenience to avoid disturbing the existing arrangement of the records.

The third main section of this list deals with the Minutes and other papers of the Coward Trust and related bodies, which are preserved in its safe in the Coward Room. (Some Coward Trust/Wymondley College administrative correspondence and papers are shelved in the New College strongroom and included in the first two sections of the list.) The records in the Coward Trust safe are prefixed 'CT'.

As no major re-arrangement of the shelving of the MSS. has been undertaken (partly in order to avoid interruption of the daily use of the records), and in order to make this list of the greatest possible use, a comprehensive Index, mainly of persons, places and institutions, has been made by Miss J. Miller, (principally) and Mr. Storey, Where the bulk of the material warrants, institutional records have been indexed under various sub-headings, so that in the Index some kind of archival structure is recreated for those institutions whose records have survived in a confused or fragmented state.

Writers of letters and authors of works have in all cases been indexed, as have some addressees, generally the recipients of large groups of letters. Persons, places and subjects mentioned in correspondence and papers have been indexed selectively. In the time available it has not always proved possible to make a positive identification of persons, particularly of homonymous writers, and in these cases the searcher is advised to pay particular attention to the date, contents and context of the documents to which reference is given, since several entries for the same name may in fact refer only to one person, whereas entries under a single name may conceal several persons, in particular father and son bearing the same name.

Records after 1914 have generally been ignored in listing, except in the case of some bundles commencing before this date but extending beyond it, and in the case of a number of items of particular importance. However, in no case should it be assumed that inclusion of a document in the list means that it is automatically available for study.

No individual references have been made to the stamps or postmarks borne by many wrappers and envelopes, but it should be noted that many local cancellations of the first decades of the nineteenth century and numerous early postage stamps give these MSS. an incidental interest for the postal historian.

The Commission's thanks are due to the Governors of New College, London and to the Coward Trustees for making their records available for listing and research, and to the Librarian, the College Secretary, Miss M. A. Canning, and her assistant, Mrs. P. A. Smith, for their generous assistance to the Commission's staff during the work of listing.





LITERARY MANUSCRIPTS.

L.1. DODDRIDGE CORRESPONDENCE:

The eleven volumes listed below consist principally of letters addressed to Philip Doddridge (1702-51; DNB), to his wife Mercy (née Maris, 1708-90) and to his children. They include series of letters from Doddridge to his wife and family (L.1/1-2), and to Dr. Samuel Clarke (1684-1750; DNB) (L.1/10). The provenance of this collection is somewhat complicated, but is partly explained by the descriptive list of section L.1a which follows.

The first nine volumes were assembled by Samuel Newth (see L.8-9) from manuscripts presented to the College by Joshua Wilson; they bear Newth's manuscript contents lists and item numbers. The tenth volume (Doddridge's letters to Clark) is similarly put together, though different in format. Volume 11 (letters to Mrs. Doddridge from Sarah Stonhouse, née Ekins, the Doctor's ward) was assembled from obviously related material found elsewhere in 1965; further material virtually providing a 'twelfth volume' of correspondence has been discovered, and will be found later in this Report under L.1/12.

The letters were used by John Doddridge Humphreys in the production of his Correspondence and Diary of Philip Doddridge (5 vols., 1829-31) and most of the items published by Humphreys (i.e. the bulk of those not marked 'omitted') bear pencil markings which clearly demonstrate the nature and extent of his editorial infidelities. Some of the letters have previously been pasted down on the pages of a printed volume and are accordingly damaged. A few more are torn, especially at the seals; severely damaged letters are indicated in this list. In some cases wrappers or parts of letters have been used in repair - for example, part of L.1/4/97 has been used to repair L.3/4/112.

Doddridge, unlike his wife, was a most methodical correspondent; on his own letters he generally inserted the full date or place of writing, and many of his incoming letters have a generous amount of neat shorthand endorsement.

In this list, all dates have been given as New Style, and this practice has been followed in the chronologically arranged finding list of Philip Doddridge's correspondence at New College and elsewhere, which forms an appendix to this Report. Where it has been impossible to determine which of his daughters is addressed, the name of the addressee is given as 'Miss Doddridge'. Square brackets have been used both in the expansion of names and in supplying dates of letters from various calculations.

A microfilm of these eleven volumes of Doddridge material is available at Dr. Williams's Library.
