

Salford Hundred occupied the south-east part of Lancashire. In Anglo-Saxon times hundred courts transacted various kinds of official proceedings, including the trying of some cases. However, after the Norman Conquest they declined in importance and Salford Hundred Court was unusual in surviving into the nineteenth century. The Salford Hundred Court Act of 1846 extended its jurisdiction. By the Salford Hundred Court Act of 1868 it was merged in 1868 with Manchester Court of Record under the title of Salford Hundred Court. The Court was abolished in 1971 by the Courts Act of 1971.

Towards 1867 the proceedings consist chiefly of appointments to posts in the Borough of Salford and to a few outside its area within the Hundred.
