COMMITTEES

"Charlestown Choral Society", unsigned notes of annual general meetings, committee meetings and other meetings and of performances or events attended by members of the choir with also copies of reports and printed extracts of reviews (2 small vols., first vol. with part of one page torn off and second vol. with several pages missing)

1897-1922

The first vol. contains an attached letter, 1906, with printed letter heading of Charlestown Congregational Church, Broughton Road, Pendleton. The second contains loose and attached printed programmes of services by several choirs, incl. one for an "Allies' Festival" held in the Royal Technical Institute, Peel Park, Salford, with performances of songs and recitals (sometimes also "National Dance") relating to Belgium, Serbia, France, Russian, Italy and Britain, some references to Portugal, Rumania, Montenegro and Japan, 1917; the cover shows a coloured representation of the flags of several of the allies, incl. Japan.

REGISTRATION

- /R1 Index evidently to names of scholars in Sunday School, arranged first by alphabetical order of first letter of surname and then by boys' and girls' names, giving names, ages in years, addresses (usually not giving street number), names of parents or guardians, numbers allotted to classes for identification and "Remarks" (usually on leaving or returns after absences) (1 vol. containing loose docs.) 1829-63  
 This was received with a note saying that a copy had been made for Manchester and Lancashire [Family History] Society.
- /R2 Sunday School: unsigned minutes of meetings of various committees, some at end of vol., 1885-86, 1889-91; register of scholars (entries numbered 1120-1561, almost all of girls), giving names and, usually, ages, addresses, occupations ("School" usually, sometimes "Work" or "Home" instead), names of parents, numbers allotted to classes for identification and names of teachers, entered during years 1896-1918; rough pencilled list of books and rough list in ink of number of programmes, n.d. (1 small vol., many pages torn out) 1885-86, 1889-91, 1896-1918, n.d.
- /R3/1-3 Registers, noting names, addresses (sometimes) and weekly attendances, Jan., 1900-Jan., 1903, 1908-14 (3 small vols.) 1900-03, 1908-14
- /R4 Class register, printed for Charlestown Congregational Sunday School, marked "Choir", noting weekly attendances by choirmaster, organist and others (1 small vol., in same style as N/CC7/R3/1-3, various annotations added) 1905-08
- /R5 Register noting names (often of individuals named in N/CC7/R4) and attendances, usually weekly, "No Rehearsal" written against some dates (1 small vol. in same style as N/CC7/R3-4) 1909-12

- CC7/R6 Register, noting names (often of individuals named in N/CC7/R4-5) and attendances, sometimes weekly and sometimes at intervals of a few months, "No Rehearsal" written against some dates (1 small vol. in same style as N/CC7/R3-5) 1913-14
- /R7 Register, printed as "Superintendent's Register", with rolls of officers and teachers in 1910 and 1925 (incl. dates of appointments), record of weekly attendances by officers and teachers and weekly class totals for scholars, 1910-12, some details begun to be entered for early part of year 1913, record of attendances at teachers' business meetings, Jan.-July, 1911, list of names and addresses of officers in Band of Hope, in International Bible Reading and in Benevolent Society, 1911, record of weekly financial contributions, July, 1910-Dec., 1912, statistics relating to School, on 31st Dec. of years 1909-11 and two notes of events concerning teachers at the School in 1910 and 1911 (1 vol.) 1910-13, 1925
- /R8 Record of weekly attendances by scholars giving names and, for 1938, addresses, with list of names begun but not dated (1 vol.) 1937-38, n.d.

- /M1 Written description and estimate for a new independent chapel, Broad Street, Pendleton, architect unnamed but describing himself as having just completed a large dissenting chapel at High Wycombe (1 doc., very poor condition, torn and small parts missing) n.d.
- /M2-5 Plans, elevation and section with same device (circle containing a triangle and the words "Sine favore") as in N/CC7/M1: n.d.
- /M2 Ground plan with small section showing rise of floor on either side of the rostrum; n.d.
- /M3 Plans of gallery and of boys' and girls' school-rooms; n.d.
- /M4 Side elevation; n.d.
- /M5 Section with colouring n.d.

- /M8 Incomplete printed view of proposed independent chapel, Heckmondwike, West Riding of Yorkshire, architects Paull and Ayliffe, India Buildings, Cross Street, Manchester; n.d.
