

The congregation of Monton Church traces its origin back to 1662 when the Rev. Edmund Jones, Vicar of Eccles, was ejected from his living under the Act of Uniformity. The Presbyterian congregation which followed him and his successors had at first no settled place of worship but in 1697 land at Monton was bought for the site of a chapel which was built before the end of the century. By the early nineteenth century the congregation had become Unitarian. The Church which replaced the Chapel was completed in 1875. An infant school was added to the existing Day School in 1848 and in 1864 a larger building was erected for the Day and Sunday Schools. In 1889 this building was replaced by a larger one for Monton Memorial Schools (incl. the Day and Sunday Schools). Further information on the history of the Church and Schools may be obtained from one of the booklets or newspaper articles included in this collection.
