# Records of The Palace Company (Wellingborough) Ltd., Gloucester Place, Wellingborough.

Accession 1978/102

The Palace Company was formed as a cinema and theatre company in 1910, by two brothers, Mr. C.H. Brown and Mr. G.W. Brown, builders of Wellingborough, with Mr. W.F.J. Hewitt, who was the manager of the company. The King's Palace, in Church Street, Wellingborough, opened on February 7th., 1910, showing electric pictures and variety acts, such as "Oto" the educated pugdog and "Kyoto" the Japanese contortionist, conjuror and juggler.

In 1911, the Palace Company opened the Palace Theatre in Rushden High Street and, in 1914, the Electric Theatre was also opened on the Market Square, Wellingborough.

In August, 1924, the three men formed a new private company, known as the Palace Company (Wellingborough) Ltd., consisting of the Palace Theatre, Wellingborough, with lock-up shops and offices in Gloucester Place, Park Road and Church Street, the Electric Theatre at Market Square, Wellingborough, the Palace Theatre in High Street, Rushden and land in College Street and Alfred Streed, Rushden, later used to build the Ritz Cinema. Mr. G.W. Brown, Mr. C.H. Brown and Mr. W.F.J. Hewitt became the directors of the company and by 1928, Mr. Leonard Hewitt had become joint manager of the Palace Company with Mr. W.F.J. Hewitt.

In the early 1930's, the Palace Company underwent changes. The Electric Theatre was renamed the Regal Cinema, the Old King's Palace became Roper's Garage and the new Palace Theatre opened in Gloucester Place. Of these theatres only the Palace Theatre in Gloucester Place, Wellingborough and the Ritz Cinema in College Street, Rushden remain today.

Theatre's Weekly Expenses Book: 3 Description as above. With pencilled in total expenses of Wellingborough Palace, Rushden Palace and The Electric Theatre, Wellingborough. Does not include expenses for films.

April 1924-Aug 1929

Monthly Account Book: Total receipts are recorded on the left and expenses on the right are recorded separately. From March 1912 the receipts are divided between those from the Wellingborough Palace and those from The Electric Theatre. Expenses include those for films.

Feb 1910-Oct 1913

Monthly Account Book: Description as above. Receipts divided between those from the Palace and those from The Electric Theatre.

Oct 1913-Dec 1916

6 Yearly Accounts Book: Total receipts recorded on the left with takings from the Palace, Electric Theatre and Kings Hall and other receipts. Total expenses recorded separately on the right.

#### (C) The Palace Theatre, Rushden

Theatre's Weekly Expenses Book: The theatre's expenses are divided into categories:-Staff - their names and wages Attendants - their names and wages Band - their names and wages Petty Cash Hall Cleaner & Billing Artistes - the names of the acts and the

total amount paid to them with the name of the play (if any) in which they took part. This includes names of any films shown.

2 Weekly Account Book: Total receipts recorded on the right for each week. Total expenses recorded separately on the left. Advertising accounts recorded at the back, i.e. those firms paying for advertisements on the fire curtain, in the corridors and in the programme.

3 Monthly Account Book: Total receipts for each week recorded on the left. Expenses recorded separately on the right. From July 1918 weekly sheets of receipts for each performance included.

  Gives the name of the production (film, play, opera or pantomime) and in which theatre it took place, the name of the company giving the production or hiring out the film, the dates of the production, the takings for each performance and the share of these taken by The Palace Company less miscellaneous expenses.
