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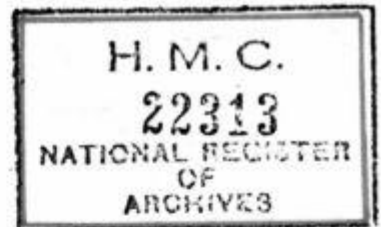

The Records of
Reynolds Hygrade Castings Ltd.,
The Foundry, Little Harrowden.

Accession 1978/32

The Reynolds family began business in Little Harrowden in about 1850. They started as blacksmiths and were occupied in the usual work of a village smith at that time. Mr. Tom Reynolds (the founder) shod horses, repaired farm implements and was a mainstay of the village community - one has to remember the importance of the blacksmith before the advent of the motor car. He married and had a son, John Reynolds, who also went into the family business. Even now the firm had been responsible for the invention of one of the first ploughs and the concept of beginning a foundry was no longer an idea on the drawing board.

Eventually John Reynolds married and they also had a son, called Thomas, who was born in 1905. By now the foundry was producing grey iron castings for engineers. A grey iron casting is a combination of pig iron and scrap which is melted together in a furnace called a Cupola. The Cupola is fed with coke and in those days the air supply was produced by means of a blower driven from a wheel turned by a horse. In 1928, a Fielding and Platt oil engine was installed at a cost of £303 and this supplied the electricity to drive the blowers.

Mr. Thomas Reynolds married and had two children, Mrs. Margaret J. Vaughan (the present Managing Director, who was born in 1927) and Thomas William Reynolds (born 1929). After National Service and his apprenticeship, Thomas Reynolds worked in the family firm about a year until his early death in 1954. Mrs. Vaughan came into the firm in 1943/4 and today efficiently runs the business with her son, Thomas Reynolds (born 1956), who came into the business in 1972. Mr. Thomas Reynolds has one sister, who is not connected with the firm.

Just after the war, the company produced castings for electric irons - this has now been discontinued. Today all castings are sold by the cwt. Reynolds Hygrade Castings Ltd. is a progressive firm which makes foundry machinery by the shell moulding process and carries out many and varied specialist orders.
