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Records of Messrs. Burrows Bros., Drapers, of 41, Gold Street, Northampton

Accession 1977/222

The drapery business of Burrows Bros. closed in 1977, after just over a century. David Edwin Burrows began the business at 2, The Drapery, Northampton, in a shop rented from Mr. A. Gardner, as recorded in the Improvement Commissioners Rate Book for July, 1873. In 1884, the firm was moved to 6, Gold Street, subsequently changing premises several times. Northampton directories show the firm at 38/40, Gold Street in 1890, 38, Gold Street in 1894, 60, Gold Street in 1898, and finally, 41, Gold Street in 1929/30.

Burrows Bros. also operated a goods delivery service for their customers who lived in the country, within a radius of about 15 miles, and mainly in the south and west of the county. Goods were taken to one or two centres within each village, these acting as collection points for all customers in that village. The need for this service, however, had fallen considerably by the 1940's, when it was then discontinued.

The firm also owned a millinery shop at 205, Welling-borough Road, known as "Dorothea". Mrs Dorothy Lilian Burrows was its proprietress. The shop, which is first mentioned in a Northampton directory of 1928, closed down in 1952.
