## James Idwal Jones (1900-82)

James Idwal Jones represented the Wrexham constituency in Parliament for the Labour Party from 1955 until his retirement in 1970. The son of a Rhos miner, he became active in politics from an early age. He was educated at Ruabon Grammar School and Bangor Normal College, later gaining the BSc Economics degree of London University. He taught in Rhos from 1928 onwards becoming headmaster of Grango School in 1938. He was defeated as the Labour candidate for the Denbigh Division in the 1951 election.

As MP for Wrexham, J.I.Jones was concerned, amongst other things, with the setting up of the industrial estate, and the permanent establishment of Cartrefle College. These and his many interests including education, the Welsh language and affairs, the creation of employment opportunities, are all well represented in his papers. His brother T.W.Jones, later Lord Maelor, was Labour MP for Merioneth for the period 1951-66.

He was a prolific contributor of articles to the press, many are in the collection. He was author of a number of books including the first historical atlas of Wales, published in 1952. His records were deposited by his son, Assistant Director of Education for the county of Clwyd.

[Note: The following collection consists mainly of a series of scrap-books compiled by the late J.I.Jones (JIJ) together with correspondence on general and particular subjects. The scrap-books contain press cuttings and other printed matter, and original correspondence, and often include notes by the compiler expanding or commenting on particular items. The catalogue names only some of the correspondents, and refers to only a selection of the topics covered.]
