It is customary for millers who grind for hire in that part of the country to buy the wheat for the party and to pay for it themselves, not receiving payment for it until two or three weeks later. He regrets the bank's refusal to grant him credit so that he was obliged to buy in a few weeks' stock of wheat while the farms were involved in spring field work and the markets were scantily supplied and needy buyers had to pay high prices. If he had had the means he would have bought corn when it was cheap and sold it at high prices. Instead he had to pay gradually increasing prices with a consequent lowering of his level of profit. He asks the bank to allow him a few weeks credit of £300 - £400 in order to enable him to run the business efficiently.
