COPY WILL of Dr. Geoffrey Glyn. 15 monetary bequests totalling £144 11s. 8d., £20 to each of his sisters who survive him; a year's wages and 20s. to Thomas ap Rowland and all his servants at the time of his death. Other bequests comprise: his grey gelding, his second saddle and bridle, his 'lydaye' and a year's wages to Owen Glyn; his cloak, boots and spurs to Sir Richard Rowland; his wood knife and cross-bow to his uncle John ap Rhys, and his best ring with the greatest turquoise in it to Mistress Grace; his best saddle and bridle, the ring with a death's head enamelled on to Dr. Ellis; his bay gelding to the Bishop of Ely; and his grey colt and his standing gilt cup to the Bishop of Rochester. He leaves the frier howse in Bangor and his lands in North Wales and elsewhere to Morris, Bishop of Rochester, and William, Bishop of Bangor, to the use of a grammar school to be maintained at Bangor 'for the better educacon of bringing vpp of poore mens children', £20 to be spent on 'edifying' the building, and £400 to the bishops to purchase lands, reversions, or annual commodities to the yearly value of £20, to the use of ten scholars 'diligently to be brought vpp at the same scole'.

Concerning the arrears of rent the writer states that he is enclosing a letter written by Beyrch himself, in which he admits default of payment.

LETTER: Edward Bates to [Henry Rowlands] Bishop of Bangor. He and Mr. Henry Rowlands, goldsmith went to see Mr. Johnes at Lincolns Inn, and the writer gave him his deed for the houses called the almshouses in pa. St. George, Southwark, desiring him to make over a conveyance to the Dean and Chapter of Bangor Cathedral. But Mr. Johnes 'made a speach concerning mortmayne' Mr. Dean did not come to London during Trinity Term as he had promised, and Mr. Johnes left soon after the end of term. The writer hopes that the business will be completed upon his return.
