The writer has requested Sir F. Dent and Captain Rayner to supply further details and to state whether they were eye-witnesses, or whether they were reporting information received from another party. He agrees no public enquiry should be held until the evidence is closely examined, for fear of weakening the authority of the Chief Constable [this probably refers to the activities of the Trades Union Magistrates in Holyhead during General Strike].

LETTER: Comm. Sir R. H. Williams-Bulkley, Bart., K.C.B. to Clerk to the Lieutenancy enclosing carbon copy of letter from R.H. W-B. to Lord Chancellor, together with his reply.

Railway and Trades Union members, played some part in the General Strike. In the writer's opinion it is futile to appoint such persons [to the Bench] as representatives of the working class, as their record of attendance for the last three and a half years is very low. He believes their excuse is that they lose a day's pay if they attend. He hopes to receive L.C's. remarks on the matter.
- 2) LETTER of reply from L.C. to R.H. W-B. promising to enquire into specific complaints of misconduct during the General Strike. However the L.C. will not take action against Magistrates who, because they were Trades Unionists, merely took part in the strike.

22 1929 March 25-27

LETTER: R.L. Overbury, Secretary of Commissions, House of Lords to Sir R.H. Williams-Bulkley Bart., K.C.B. The Lord Chancellor has received an explanation from Captain Swan and a declaration by the tenant farmer who had given Capt. S. permission to shoot on his land. The L.C. deems that Capt. S. was guilty of a technical trespass but will not remove his name from the Commission [of the Peace].

1937 June 3-4

LETTER: R. Williams-Bulkley to Walter Jones concerning the allocation of seats allotted to Anglesey for the visit of the King and Queen. Only 20 seats are allotted and the Lord Lieutenant is to allocate them: a situation which he regards as preposterous. The writer asks W.J. to let him know if he has omitted anyone from the list of names.

The Chairman of the Advisory Committee is responsible for inviting suitable Justices to place their names on the Supplemental List. Should they refuse the Lord Chancellor may remove their names permanently from the Commission [of the Peace]. In future all J.P.s will have to sign an undertaking that they will apply for the Supplemental List when they are 75 years old.
