In 1914 College sold and conveyed to Francis Ewart Savill their property known as Upper Chalmington Farm in parish of Cattistock, Dorset, then in occupation of Thomas Turner Diment as tenant of College. That farm which was parcel of manor of Sydling, was distinct from the Chalmington property (Lower or South Chalmington) out of which chief or quit rent of £1 6s 8d was (and still is) payable to College. Liability to this annual rent of £1 6s 8d is mentioned in the 'Particulars with the Conditions of Sale by Auction of Chalmington Farm Dorset', etc, at Corn Exchange, Dorset on 26 Nov 1924. The distinction between Higher, Upper or North Chalmington and Lower or South Chalmington is noticed in Hutchins's History of Dorset, Vol. II (1774), pp. 282-3. H. Chitty, 1929.
