Memoranda (circa 1391) relating to Takely Priory and the churches of Isleworth, Twickenham, Hampton-on-Thames and Heston.

(a) Edward III having siezed this priory by letters patent dated 13 April 14 Ed.III granted custody of it to the Prior, John de Marshmills, at a fee farm of £126 p.ann. secured by mainprise of Robert de Chedworth and others, saving by way of rent (apportum) to the King any sum which the prior was bound to pay to the superior religious house,

that of St.Walery-sur-mer in Picardy. By other letters patent dated 10 May same year the priory itself with its knights fees, advowsons, goods, chattels and appurtenances was restored to the prior. By other letters patent dated 26 May 25 Ed.III the King in consideration of a subsidy of £139 forgave the prior arrears of the fee farm, amounting to £168.13.4, which the prior was unable to pay occasione pestillencie mortalis (the Black Death) nuper invalescentis, and granted that the mainpernors or sureties should not be distrained on while the war lasted provided that the Prior continued to pay the fee farm of £126. After this Prior's death, by letters patent dated 24 November 31 Ed.III custody of the Priory was granted to Firmin de Fontanis, a monk of St.Walery-sur-mer, the new prior, with John Bernard and others as main pernors under the same condition as to payment of the fee farm. By other letters patent, dated 16 February 35 Ed.III after the making of peace with France the priory was regranted to the prior saving any arrears. By other letters patent, dated 12 June 37 Ed.III the King granted twenty marks to Juliana, widow of William de Clynton, to be levied on the Priory out of these arrears. By other letters patent dated 11 June 43 Ed.III after peace was broken the priory was granted to Prior Firmin with Nicholas de Sterteford and others as main pernors. By other letters patent, dated 20 May 44 Ed.III custody was granted to Prior Firmin at a reduced fee farm of £66.13.4, William Strete of London being the main pernor and accountable for arrears.

By letters patent dated 18 May 1 Ric. II custody was granted to brother Gerard de Errencourt with John Duk and others as

main perrors, their liability for arrears prior to 35 Ed. III being respited; and by other letters patent dated 8 September 11 Ric. II prior Gerard was licensed to assign the custody to John Luscope free of arrears prior to 16 February 35 Ed. III.

(b) At an inquisition before King's Escheator south of Trent held at Takely, 20 May 6 Ed. II, it was found that the late prior did not hold the priory of Takely or any other lands in England of the King in capite or as a cell to the abbey of St. Walery-sur-mer, and that on the day of his death he held no lands or tenements temporal or spiritual in England except as guardian (custos) or proctor for the said abbey at the will of the monks; and that the priory of Takely was not a cell to the abbey, nor he a prior perpetual, but a guardian removable at pleasure; and that the King and his royal progenitors never had custody of the priory during any vacancy of the abbacy.

(c) It appears by pleas of Michaelmas Term 29 and 37 Ed. III that the priory is exonerated from rendering certain almsgifts, viz. two bushels of mesline head (mixtilis) of corn and rye mixed to the poor of Isleworth, two and a half quarters of beans and peas to the poor of Twickenham and three quarters of beans to the poor of Heston.

(d) It appears by an inquisition at Dunmow 22 November 3 Ed. III before Simon de Berford, King's Escheator south of Trent, that the abbot and monks of St. Walery-sur-mer are enfeoffed of the manor of Takely

by grant in frank almoign of Henry I confirmed by Henry III and that the manor has never been sequestrated by the King on the death, resignation or removal of any abbot.

(e) At the time when Queen Philippa's bailiffs were molesting the prior of Takely contrary to the tenor of the above mentioned pleas on the question of the said alms gifts the King issued a writ of prohibition dated 10 June 43 Ed. III. A similar writ went against the bailiff of the manor of Isleworth in 46 Ed. III.

(g) Guy de Penteris who came over with the Conqueror gave two hides and twenty acres with the appurtenances in Meldebourne to the monks of St. Walery.

(h) All charters confirmatory touching the possessions of Takely priory are under seal of the abbot of St. Walery and not of the monk or prior of Takely.

A copy of this mutilated document is given in No. 52 = 1573 a survey and rental of the moiety of the manor, from which the date, & name of the mayor of Winchester can be completed. Prefixed to the copy is a long memorandum which shows that the John Wodelok, formerly husband of Margaret Tank is he who died in 1389 (v. No 7 = 1512); and since his wife at that time was Agnes Wodelok, who survived till 1405 (ibid.), while Margaret was at that time wife of John Tank (v. No. 9 = 1514), it

would seem that the marriage of Margaret with John Wodelok must have been annulled in order to make way for Agnes. The presence of Margaret at John's death bed (1514) and the reference to her in the deposition of Agnes (1517) seems to show that the relations, eventually at least, were amicable enough.
