An inquiry had been held at Sherborne on 11 Aug. 1403 by John Savage, Escheator of Dorset: the jury had found that the Abbot & Convent had failed from 1364 onwards to fulfil the conditions on which they held the Manor -

advowson, and that the Chapel had been dismantled for 20 years, and replaced by a small oratory which was used as a farmhouse store. The Escheator thereupon resumed the Manor & Advowson for the Crown. A writ was issued to him from Westminster 2 October 1403 to report on his inquiry and submit the proceedings thereof. The Plea in Chancery was held on 12 November 1403 at Westminster & resulted as above.
