VI Bursars' Account Rolls & Books etc.

The College Accounts were kept in:

- 1) the Bursars' Book: contained general view of the whole accounts under heads of "Custus", "Solutioes", "Receipta", also the Bursar's Account, the Price of Corn every quarter and details of the transfer from one Bursar to another
- 2) the College Ledger: containing fair transcript of the "Custus" and "Solutioes" from Bursars' Book, this was the Book produced at the 1st, 2nd & 3rd Quarterly Meetings for the passing of Accounts. None of the receipts were passed till the Sealing Week.
- 3) The Trust Book: contains accounts of Estates of which the College were Trustees.
- 4) Corn Book or Bursars' Audit Book: contained the summs sent paid to the College by Estates &c on lease.
- 5) Progress Book, or Bursar's Book: the Bursars had nothing to do with this book but the Receipts and Expenses on Progresses were entered by them at the Sealing. (Note - these books are preserved with the Progress Records in Section XI)

b) The Wood Book: contains accounts of Timber and Underwood sold, salaries of Woodwards etc.

7) The Petworth School Book: contains a private account of the Petworth School Trust for the use of the Bursars.

* "The Bursar's Assistant" gives the name of "Bursar's Book" to the account of first entry, and "College Ledger" to the fair copy book.
