Note. The 'private Assistant in the employment of the Head Master' upon whom they threw blame for Rebellion was Rev John Williams. See 'Copies of Letters relating to the Rev John Williams and the Win Coll Rebellion of 1818' two MS Vols in the Fellows' Library, D 16. The Rev John Williams, of Balliol College, Oxford, B.A. 1814; M.A. 1838; was Subpraecceptor at Winchester under Dr Gabell, 1814-18. He was subsequently Rector of Edinburgh Academy, and Archdeacon of Cardigan. See the D.N.B. The Above-mentioned letters relating to him are 'in the possession of the Directors of

Edinburgh Academy, 'I obtained copies of them and gave the copies to the Fellows Library. H. Chitty.

- 499 1 Dec Winchester Letter from Dr Gabell to Dr Butler of Shrewsbury, who had inquired whether 'it is usual, in cases of declared expulsion, to change the sentence into dismissal, or even to revoke it altogether.'
Note the paragraph in this letter: 'You have heard of the proceedings of the boys probably at Eton, and at the Charter-House, but perhaps you do not know that the Military College at Sandhurst has been in rebellion. The boys drew up in battle array against the professors.'

- 500 n.d. Memorial of Warden Huntingford and the Head Master (Dr Williams) to William IV for the continuance by him of the Medals annually given by George IV. (Draft or copy).

- 505-515 DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE ELECTION OF HARRY LEE AS WARDEN 1763 etc.
- 505 12 Dec Abstract of Return, directed to Visitor (Dr John Thomas, Bp of Winchester) of his Vicar General, and setting forth, under seal of New Coll, proceedings at Election. Visitor is besought to confirm Election of Harry Lee, etc.
- 506 13 Dec Declaration, under hand and seal of Thomas Hayward, Sub-Warden of New Coll who presided at Election, that he has inflicted punishment prescribed by College Statutes upon certain Fellows who absented themselves from Election without cause, some entirely and others from the 2nd Scrutiny. Attested by Herbert Beaver, notary public.
- 507a 'Case of the late Election of a Warden to the College near Winchester regularly stated.' Signed by Richard Phelps (Fellow of New Coll ?1740-69). States his case against validity of Election.
- 507b Copy of 507a.
- 508 Paper which refers to pp. 34 and 41 of some book or document not specified, relating to Elections of Dr Braithwaite in 1712 and Dr Cobb in 1720.
- 509 Counsel's brief. Instructions to Mr Smalbrooke to appear on behalf of New Coll, and their Warden Elect (Dr Purnell) of Win Coll, case to be argued before Visitor on 19 Dec.
- 510 23 Dec Judgement of Visitor deciding that Warden Harry Lee was duly elected. Extracted from Registry of Bishop, and attested by Thomas Adderley, 'Actuary assumed'.
- 511 'State of Proceedings in the Election of a Warden of the College near Winchester on the Death of Dr Christopher Golding.' This Statement (in the handwriting of Harry Lee) ends 'Afterwards his

Lordship acquainted Mr Lee that he would admit him into ye said office and administer ye Oaths to him tomorrow morning at his Palace at Chelsea, which was accordingly done.'

- 512a&b 24 Dec Two certificates under hand and seal of Bp:
1. That Warden Harry Lee made requisite declaration that he would conform 'to the Liturgy of the Church of England as it is now by Law established.'
 2. That he subscribed to 39 articles, etc, and took the requisite Oaths, on his institution as Warden.
- 513a&b 1764 Memoranda of Warden Harry Lee's reading himself in as Warden:
1. On Sunday 1 Jan in his parish church of Rowsham, Oxon (where he was Rector), attested by Thos. Creek and Will. West.
 2. On Sunday 22 Jan in College Chapel, attested by Rice Price, Sub-Warden, and Rob. Marslen, Clerk.
- 514 Paper showing how the Fellows of New Coll voted:
1. 1763 Dec, at Election whereby Harry Lee became Warden of Win Coll. (The other candidates were George James Sale and Thomas Hayward.)
 2. 1764 Jan, at Election whereby Thomas Hayward became Warden of New Coll.
 3. 1768 Aug, at Election whereby John Oglander became Warden of New Coll.
- 515 Another paper showing how they voted, in 1789, at Election whereby George Isaac Huntingford became Warden of Win Coll. (The other Candidates were Smith, Sissmore and Bathurst).

523-528 KIRBY'S 'FOREIGN MATTERS'

523 n.d. Paper of 4 pages (a corner torn off) containing:

1. Copy of narrative by Dr John Warner, Bp of Rochester 1638-66, of his unrequited services and sufferings for 'The King, the Church, and the poor Clergy,' and of his sermon (preached c.1626) which got him into trouble, but which was afterwards treated 'by a learned pen' as a clear prophecy of Charles I's death.
2. Copy of series of queries 'worthy to be decided by a Committee of the H. of Commons', first being 'whether it be Treason to be for or against the King', last, 'whether we have as much skill in building up as (in) pulling down.'
3. Note that foregoing were copied from paper given to writer 'by Dr Holdsworth', who had it from his brother: the original supposed to be at Magdalen College.

524 1680 Feb 2 'Lambhith house' Copy of circular letter, which Dr William Sancroft, Arch of Canterbury, sent to Bishops of his Province concerning Augmentations of poor Vicarages and Curacies. Eng. Paper.

The persecuted Protestant Ministers of France, who had fled to England:

525 n.d. Copy of a petition, in Latin, to Dr William Sancroft, Archbp of Canterbury, signed by 9 of such Ministers and 28 Sep 1683 (sic) copy of brief or letter on behalf of all such Ministers which Archbp sent to Bp of London for transmission to all Bps of the Province. Eng.

526 1681 Nov 24 (sic) Letter from Dr. George Morley, Bp of Winchester, to Dr Walter Dareth, Archdeacon of Winchester giving directions on this subject and enclosing (inter alia) brief from Archbp (- the above mentioned brief or another). Eng. Paper.

527 n.d. paper Letter from 'Morley of C.C.' (Christ Church, Oxford) to 'The Earle of Pembroke', relates, rather cryptically, to need for making the Thames more navigable.
Note. Crosfield's Diary (MS.): 31 Aug 1635, a barge was brought up the Thames to Oxford which was the first ever came, and the King was then at Woodstock.

528 1670 Aug 29 Meonstoke Letter from Robert Mathew, rector of Meonstoke, to Dr George Morley, Bp of Winchester concerning appointment of a curate for Soberton Chapel. Paper.
Note. For Robert Mathew's career see A. K. Cook op. cit. Appendix III.

529 (16)55 Nov 20 London Letter, from W. Pullein to Warden Harris. Eng. Paper. see also 450.

530 1661 Nov 22 Letter from Robert Pettie to Warden Burt concerning renewal of College Charter of Privileges. Eng. Paper.

- 531 1701 Oct 3 Letter from Dr Peter Mew Bp of Winchester, to Warden Nicholas, enclosing request (not preserved) from Governor of Portsmouth for presentation by College of a person recommended by him for Portsmouth Vicarage.
- 532 1716 Jan 17 Letter from William Jones to Mr Thomas Cranley. Jones's bill had been deemed excessive. He defends various items but offers an abatement.

Note. 'A shallow box, which was in the Warden's Study, when I was first given the use of the room in 1907.' H. Chitty.
- 553 1567, 1576, 1592, 1599 Copy of:
1. Bp (Robert) Horne's Injunction 15, 10 Sep 1567, that at Elections poor boys are to be preferred to richer boys and that bribes for admission or election are not to be taken by Warden or Posers.
 2. Bp Horne's Injunction 13, 1576, against bribery at Elections.
 3. Bp (Thomas) Cooper's decision 27 Aug 1592, defining time at which Rolls 'ad Winton' and 'ad Oxon' expire and forbidding resignation to be made or accepted during a Scrutiny.
 4. Bp (Thomas) Bilson's decision, (Jan 1599) on same subjects.
- 554 1659 Aug 26 Some general Rules agreed upon to be observed at the Election 'By myselve, Dr (William) Burt and Mr Schoolemaster.' Also memoranda of Sep 1661. Eng. Paper.

1702 Mar 9 Draft of letter by Dr (Richard) Traffles, endorsed as 'To Dr Stanley concerning Dr Younger', and written the day after Anne became Queen. Purpose of letter was to get Dr Younger to intimate to the Queen that a petition had been prepared against sending of royal letters or mandates to Electors, for presentation by the two Colleges to William III, but had not been delivered to him, and that it was now proposed that petition should be presented to the Queen, when she should be pleased to receive it.
- 556 23 May (no year) Upham Letter from 'E. Young' to Dr Traffles, Warden of New Coll. (3 June 1701-30 June 1703)
- 557a 1701 Jul 4 New Coll Draft of letter or Paper from Dr Richard Traffles, Warden of New Coll, to Dr Nicholas, Warden of Winchester. Marginal notes are: 'New College Business'; 'Election'; 'Nomination'; 'Kindred of the Founder'; 'King's Letters'; 'Letter of the Bp of Winton'.

- 569 1702 19 numbered pages bookwise headed: 'An Acct of the Proceedings at Farnham Castle before my Ld Bpp of Winton upon the Appeal of Mr Thorp against the Determination of the Warden, 13 Senior Fellows and Mr Sam. Adams of N. C. Oxon -' the case being heard by the Bp (Peter Mews) sitting with 2 Assessors (Sir J. Cooke and Dr Lloyd) on 18 and 19 Aug.
- 570 A paper of 'Reasons prepared for the Visitor in Mr Adam's case by Mr Wood.' (Wood was the Respondents' advocate at the hearing of the appeal.)
- 571a,b 1709 Jan 22 Letter from Dr Robert Eyre, Fellow of Win Coll to Dr Braithwaite then Warden of New Coll. With it a note about it, in handwriting of Warden Harry Lee.
- 572 Observations by Warden Nicholas on Account of Receipts and Payments in Bursars sheet of 1708.

- 580 c.1735 The Warden's allocations as paid by the Bursars and Manciple, the Butcher, the Chandler, the Sub-Warden and others. Endorsed: 'In Warden Bigg's time.'

- 581 Endorsed as 'Fees and Allowances to the Kitchen-Servants as settled abt or before the year 1728.'
- 582 n.d. 'Fees' per week for senior Cook, junior Cook, and Scullion.
- 583 n.d. Letter from Stephen Pew, complaining of misconduct of his fellow-servants in Kitchen. On another page he states duties of Senior Cook and Second Cook. The servants mentioned by name in the letter are 'Michell', 'young Richard Seward', 'Faithfull', and 'Frost'. 'Mr Bursar Thislethwaite' is also mentioned.
- 584 A paper, endorsed 'The Order for brewing Small Beer Feb 19 1749.' See also 475
- 585a,b n.d. Letter from Samuel Speed to Warden Golding. Note. Christopher Golding was appointed Warden by Bp Hoadly on ? June 1757. He died on 25 Nov 1763. Samuel Speed was Usher of the College from 2 Jan 1740 until his resignation shortly before 3 Dec 1755. He was Prebendary Bursalis of Chichester from 1739 until his death in 1775; Prebendary of Lincoln (Norton Episcopi) 1746-48; Rector of Martyr Worthy, Hants, 1748; Rector of Lichfield or Ludshelve, Hants, 1755-57; Vicar of Eling, 1757-75. He died 21 Nov 1775. His letter was probably written soon after Golding's appointment as Warden.
- 586 1764 Paper, endorsed 'Schemes to improve the Schoolmaster's Salary'.
- 587 1765 Bound up bookwise in a paper cover, marked outside 'August, 4, 1765.
