Notes:— (1) This index is not an index to the main text of this volume, but to the equivalent numbers both in the rather more detailed Descriptive List prepared for the National Register of Archives, and in other lists of recently described items. The latter can only be consulted at Winchester College, but copies of the former can be found at the libraries and institutions named on p. xxi; and of course Winchester College.

(2) In the main text of this volume the items do not appear in numerical sequence. Therefore, in using the index in connection with the published text, it is very important to consult the list of contents at the beginning to discover the order of the items.

(3) Alphabetising has been by the 'letter-by-letter' rather than by the 'word-by-word' method.

(4) It is well worth while to look for subject headings both in the index as a whole, and in the entries under Winchester College, though many cross-references have been provided.

(5) The words 'Winchester College', or their abbreviation 'Win Coll' have been omitted in connection with members of the institution, unless this would cause confusion. Thus anybody called a 'warden', or a 'fellow', will be a Warden or Fellow of Winchester College, unless some other institution is mentioned.

(6) In the subheading of people connected with Winchester College, the person's highest Wykehamical office has been given priority. Thus George I, Huntingford's first entry will be 'Huntingford, George I, warden'; numbers relating to his episcopal duties will appear after the subheading, 'bishop of Gloucester'. Unless another office is specifically mentioned, the subheading always refers back to the first office. Thus 'election as' under Huntingford refers to his election as Warden of Winchester College. The exceptions to this treatment are Bishops of Winchester, whose only connection with the College was as Bishop, and therefore Visitor of the College. In these cases the person will appear as Bishop first, but there will be a subheading, 'visitor'. However in the case of someone like Thomas Bilson, who was Bishop of Winchester, but was also Warden of Winchester College, the fact of his having been Warden will have priority over his episcopal office.

(7) Information about people has been confined to the giving of the title and office of the person relevant to the transaction involved in the document, unless serious confusion would arise if further information were not given. The exception to this rule is that such titles as 'Reverend', or 'Doctor', have been omitted, as being just too common, unless they are crucial to identification.

(8) Where necessary surnames have been modernized, with alternative spellings treated in the normal way, except in the case of scholars of Winchester College. In their cases, the version found in T.F. Kirby's *Winchester Scholars* has been used, unless there is a commonly accepted version which differs from his; for instance the final 'e' of Robert Thurber has not been kept, despite Kirby's retention of it.

(9) Christian names have been expanded and modernized, and have even been given, where readily discoverable, when they do not appear in the descriptive lists. In this last case square brackets have not been used except in cases of real doubt. However only the first christian name is given in full, unless real confusion would result from this limitation.

(10) Place names, which only appear as part of the title or office of a person, do not appear.

(11) Most other decisions have been based upon R.F. Hunnisett's *Indexing for Editors, British Records Association, Archives and the User, No. 2.*, (1972).

(12) The following abbreviations have been used: CF (Consanguineus Fundatoris), Founder's Kin; com, commoner of Winchester College; jun, junior; sch, scholar of Winchester College; sen, senior; Win Cīty, Winchester; Win Coll, Winchester College.

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FOREWORD

by *John H. Harvey*

An account of the acquisition of the estates of Winchester College has been given in the Introduction to Volume One of this List, to which reference should be made. The present volume includes the estates alphabetically from Allington to Romsey, while it is intended that the remainder, with an index to the whole of the Estates material, should make up a third and final volume.

Past administrators of the estates: the Wardens, the annual Bursars, the Stewards of the College Manors and various clerks, developed a system of archival arrangement which it has seemed both desirable and convenient to retain. This involves some inconsistency in the spelling of names and in order: thus the traditional name for the College estate at Hamble, Hants., is Hamblerice, which is placed after Hambledon rather than before.

There are roughly 60 College estates, of which 29 were Manors and gave rise to regular series of Court Rolls as well as to the annual accounts which form a major part of the medieval record and, together with the yearly bursars' rolls, provide a financial statement almost complete for the period 1395-1556 and in great detail. It should be noted that references to the estates occur also in Volume One, and particularly that the series of surviving Vouchers for 1726-1818 (WCM 30410-35994) includes those for Estates as well as for College, while all the general series of registers are there included in the class *Domus III* (Registers of Leases, WCM 22992-23038; Court Rolls in books, WCM 23039-23131; WCM 23132-23154; miscellaneous records relating to estates and manors, WCM 23155-23203). The succession of tenants to any College leasehold must be sought from the engrossed copies in the registers as well as from the partial series of cancelled leases and counterparts listed under each estate.

EDITORIAL INTRODUCTION

Winchester College Muniments are numbered in a single series, and the Descriptive List follows the arrangement under 'College' and 'Estates' used by T. F. Kirby in the catalogues compiled at the end of the last century. For the 'College' material reference should be made to Volume One. Little attempt has been made to re-arrange Kirby's order of deeds and care must be taken to note the precise dates accordingly.

The present list has been made from the fuller descriptions in the series of foolscap volumes, prepared by the National Register of Archives, which produced the original cards by a xerographic process. Sets of these volumes can be found in the British Library; the Bodleian Library, Oxford; Cambridge University Library; The John Rylands University Library of Manchester; the National Library of Wales, Aberystwyth; the Institute of Historical Research, University of London; the Guildhall Library, London; the London Library; the Society of Antiquaries of London; New College, Oxford; the Universities of Bristol and Southampton and the County Record Offices of Berkshire, Dorset, Hampshire, Greater London, Somerset, Surrey and Wiltshire. There is also a set in the Library of Congress, Washington D.C.

The original counterparts of College Leases, surrendered original leases and surrenders of lease were listed together in alphabetical order of estates after the 'Estates'. They have been split up and placed at the end of the estate to which they relate. This gives rise to the break in the sequence of the numbers in those estates. The texts of the leases and surrenders were enrolled in the Liber Albus and Lease Registers (Vol I WCM 22992-23037), but neither the enrolments nor the series of originals is complete so that one supplements the other. In each description the land leased, the term of years and the rents to be paid remain the same as when first noted, until a change is given. All rents were annual and all documents are counterpart leases except where indicated.

A bundle of College Leases was found at Winchester Cathedral and returned to the College in 1978. They have been incorporated in the present list and given the following numbers: 18843A, 25023A, 25111A and B, 25436A, 25502A, 25813A and B, 26076A, 26293A, 26585A, 26677A, 26716A, 26901A, 27374A, 27090A, 27231A, 27600A, 27619B and C, 27669A, 27842A, 28145A, 28182A, 28326A, 28370A, 28439A, 28454A, 28489A, 28392A, 28544A, 28852A, 28910A, 28927A, 29066A to C, 29160A, 29361A to C, 29674A, 29922Ab, 29956A, 29971A and B, 30087A, 30321A.

Dates from 1 January to 24 March inclusive in documents earlier than 1752 are here assigned to the historical year. In cases where uncertainty may arise the double dating (e.g. 1603/4) is used. Dates converted from regnal years and feast days to the modern equivalent have been placed in round brackets except in descriptions of Court Rolls and Accounts. Additional information, including dates supplied or suggested from another source, is given in square brackets or preceded by the word Note. Full points are omitted where not essential.

In listing continuous series of records, e.g. Accounts and Court Rolls, blocks of numbers have been given with outside dates only. In some block

descriptions with more detail the dates have been put into chronological order. In referring to the NRA List it will be necessary to take this into account.

The date given for Account Rolls is that of the audit year, e.g. the roll for 10-11 Henry IV i.e. 1409-1410 is dated 1410. As accounts were normally rendered at Michaelmas and dated from the preceding Michaelmas only the exceptions to this rule have been given precise dates.

In the descriptions of Court Rolls double dating has been used for regnal years where the precise date is not given, except in rolls relating to the reigns of Edward III and Edward VI, which, since they began on 25 and 28 January respectively, could be misleading. In the case of runs of Court Rolls the double date is also used, e.g. 9-14 Henry IV is given as 1407/08-1412/13. In the case of copies the date at the beginning of the description refers to the original and not the copy, except where indicated.

Place names are given in modern spellings except where there is any doubt when the spelling of the document is given in quotes with the suggested modern equivalent, if any, in square brackets. The exceptions to this rule are Vernham Dean, where the College usage Fernhamsdean is retained, and Tiron for the Abbey in the diocese of Chartres, France, for which the modern equivalent would be Thiron. The College spelling Huntborne for Huntbourn has also been retained. Reference should be made to the Index for places not identified in the text.

The spellings of personal names, except in the case of known persons, have not been modernised, and appear as given in the documents, even where variations occur in the same name. These have been rationalised in the Index. Where a place name occurs as part of a personal name and is obscure the modern equivalent is given in square brackets e.g. WCM 2026 Adam de Awelstone [Alton].

The many transcripts, manuscript notes and much correspondence relating to the muniments have not been mentioned in the text. Detailed references appear to them in the NRA List and all are preserved at the College with the Deed Cards of Austin Smyth. A conversion table for Kirby's numbers is at p. xi. Individual estates are frequently mentioned in other sections of the List: the Index should be used to trace these references.

Up to and including 1700 languages other than Latin and material other than parchment are indicated, thereafter languages other than English and material other than paper are indicated, except in the leases, which are all on parchment, and in English after about 1558.

The Index, which relates to the full Descriptive List and not only to the present version, was begun by Mrs Virginia Clanchy, and Peter Gwyn then College Archivist, and continued by Bill Graham, and Roger Custance the College Archivist. Especial thanks are due to Bill Graham for a great deal of work on the place names, and for other information arising out of the preparation of the Index.

Thanks are also due to Keith Pexton for identifying some French place names at the Bibliothèque Nationale, Paris; to the staff of Surrey Record Office for advice on a number of details; to Miss Joan Gibbs of London University Library and Miss S. D. Thomson of Southampton City Record Office; to Roger Custance for frequent checking of original documents and to John Harvey for general oversight of the List at all stages, help with details, and much more besides. I would like to thank my husband and daughters who gave generously of their time to help check typescripts.

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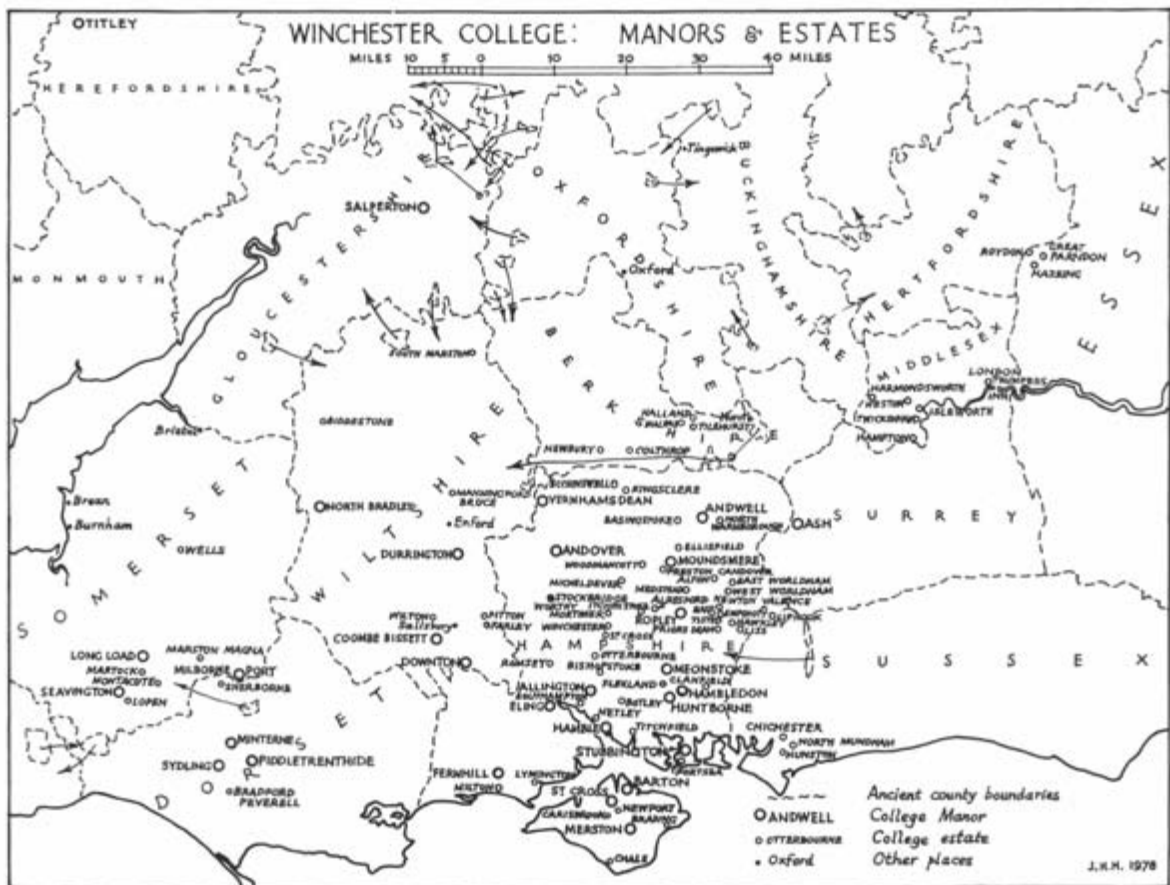

A moiety of the manor of Allington, in the parish of Durley near Southampton, was devised by John Fromond to the College in 1420 and accepted in 1446 from his feoffees subject to conditions relating to the maintenance of his chantry. The manor is a member of the Honour of Wallingford.
