ENFORD, WILTS

The church of Enford in Wiltshire was given by Henry VIII to Sir Thomas Culpeper on dissolution of Priory of St Swithun at Winchester to which it belonged, and on attainder of Culpeper was seized by the King who gave it to Win Coll under the exchange in 1543, but it had to be given up to Culpeper's heir in tail in 1551.
