# INTRODUCTION

The papers under consideration are the personal, literary and business manuscripts of Douglas Brooke Wheelton Sladen (1856-1947) a popular novelist, journalist and writer of the earlier part of this century. He bequeathed his Library and papers to the Borough on account of his long residence there, mostly in the Avenue House, the Green, now demolished.

The manuscripts consist of seventy-four volumes of wet-copy letter books ('flimsies') into which have been stuck Sladen's correspondence, drafts of books, mementoes and other miscellanea. There is an approximate division of subject matter between each volume, but within the books the order is minimal. Filing was performed at irregular intervals by either Sladen or his secretary. This method of storage has the disadvantage of making some items difficult to read as they have to be deciphered through a layer of gum and tissue paper. Where damp has affected a volume, the gum has dissolved and the papers are loose.

The collection as it now stands only covers the years 1888-1921. This means that there is very little information on Sladen's youth, early career in Australia, the United States and Japan and his life after his effective retirement following his second marriage in 1920.

Sladen's career was long and varied. The son of a West London solicitor, he attended Cheltenham College and Trinity College, Oxford and then left, in 1879, for Australia where he intended to enter politics under the protection of his uncle, Sir Charles Sladen, prime minister of Victoria. In fact, after reading for the bar at Melbourne, his interests took a more literary turn and he obtained the appointment to the chair of Modern History at Sydney University. This, and the publication of some volumes of verse, caused him to opt for a career in letters, a resolve strengthened by his uncle's premature death in 1884. He found, however, that Australia would not support him and his wife and child and therefore decided to return to the more cultured surroundings of London forthwith.

Although he had begun by writing poetry, and continued to do so for the remainder of his life, he knew well that there was more profit in journalism and prose works and it was to these forms that he mainly turned. His life from 1888 was that of a successful professional writer, based firstly in Kensington and then Richmond, whose books included popular novels, political pamphlets, society handbooks and travel guides. The preparation of the travel books caused the only disturbances in his life and, over the years, he embarked on lengthy tours of America, Japan, North Africa and Southern Europe. These produced both material for practical books and local colour for his novels. When in London, he pursued an active social career, holding regular at-homes for the literary, artistic and theatrical sets, and as a prominent member of the Authors', New Vagabonds' and Argonauts' Clubs. He did much journalistic work, first as literary editor of Today, then as literary critic of Queen and latterly as a freelance. He also succeeded in launching two handbooks for London society: Who's Who, the present form of which is owing to his work in 1897, and The Green Book of London Society in 1910-11.

The papers which he left are valuable for a number of reasons, not least for the light which they throw on the workings of literary life during this period. Sladen was a member of a group which included people such as J.K. Jerome, Conan Doyle, Rider Haggard, Charles Garvice, Walter Besant, Marie Corelli, Hall Caine, Anthony Hope, W.J. Locke, Irene Osgood, S.H. Jeyes, Gilbert Parker and F. Frankfort Moore. These were popular, professional writers rather than intellectuals, and a study of any one of them is of use insofar as it reveals the interactions within the circle as well as the great changes which were effected in the professional writer's status at this time. Sladen being naturally gregarious, his papers contain much information on these points, even though he was not particularly intimate with any one of them. The value comes perhaps from the quantity, not the quality.

The collection is also useful for a study of the sources of income available to a free-lance writer. Without film and television rights, output had to be high in order to maintain an adequate standard of living unless you were astronomically successful. Several shifts had to be resorted

to in order to extract the maximum reward from any one work. The papers show how Sladen managed his publicity and sales, introducing for the first time in England, he claimed, the American practice of the press release, the 'blurb'. They also illustrate how he would extract the maximum dividend from any single investment. Thus his trip to Japan in 1890 resulted in <u>The Japs at Home</u> (1892), <u>A Japanese Marriage</u> (1895), <u>Queer Things about Japan</u> (1903), and <u>More Queer Things about</u> <u>Japan</u> (1904) and his stay in Egypt in 1907-8 was sufficient fuel for Egypt and the English (1908), <u>The Tragedy of the Pyramids</u> (1909), <u>Queer Things about Egypt</u> (1910), <u>Oriental Cairo</u> (1910) and <u>The Curse of the Nile</u> (1913). Another aspect of financial management is revealed in his practise of extracting free accommodation and, if possible, transport for his party in return for a favourable mention in the ensuing book.

Sladen's business activities were not only confined to the writing of books. He acted as a literary agent to the Japanese artist and writer Yoshio Markino, and to minor novelists and playwrights such as Frank Butterworth, Lady Catherine Milnes Gaskell, Olive Simpson and the Australian poetess and writer Margaret Thomas, and there is other material relating to various business projects which he had in hand such as a house agency, the sale of a Richmond aircraft firm after the war, the establishment of the breeding of black foxes in Scotland and the making of films in England and America.

Sladen was not politically active and his political views, such as they were, seem to have varied considerably during his life. But although predominantly conservative, he had some surprising left-wing contacts, notably with H.M. Hyndman and his wife. He was occasionally prepared to enter into public affairs where his own reputation or income would profit by it. Thus there is much information on the Recruiting Bands project of 1915, initiated by Sladen, as well as on trade unionism and labour relations as a result of a pamphlet, <u>Cosmos</u>, issued under his name in 1919.

Although the papers relating to his business and public social life are extensive, there are fewer of an intimate character which might shed light on closer relationships.

One reason for this is that he had comparatively few friends whilst possessing a host of acquaintances. Amongst those who figure more frequently in his general correspondence are Yoshio Markino, Frank Richards, Frank Butterworth, Eustache de Lorey, Eleanor Mordaunt, Norma Lorimer, Olave Potter, Ethel Stevens and Maude ffoulkes. The last five named were at some time either companions to Sladen's first wife or his secretaries. His wife was partially incapacitated after the birth of their first child and Norma Lorimer was her companion, acting as hostess at most of the Sladen functions, for many years after their return from Australia. All of these young ladies became novelists and writers of greater or lesser repute usually having received a sound training from Sladen for whom they used to compose book reviews for Queen and other journals. Amongst others with whom Sladen had long and close relations can also be mentioned Irene Osgood, Arthur Conan Doyle, Geo. B. Burgin, C.N. and A.M. Williamson and Lena Ashwell. But the content of their letters is generally slight.

But there is no doubt that, whatever its limitations, this collection will be of the greatest use for the study of the role of the author in this period, the social relationships of different groups of authors and intellectuals and for particular subjects such as Australian poetry, the relationship of American and English literary practices, the origins of <u>Who's Who</u> and the economic bases of professional writing.

### Method of listing

Owing to limited time it has not proved possible to compile an item by item list. Each volume of the manuscripts has been taken in turn and described individually with a note made of more prominent correspondents or groups of papers. Thus the list is selective and does not give, for instance, any indication of the number of letters from any particular person nor, normally, the size of any particular group within a volume. There is an index to the mames, institutions and some subjects mentioned in the list.

# Bibliographical note

The majority of people mentioned in the list can be identified from <u>Who's Who</u>. Sladen himself wrote two volumes of memoirs, although the later one largely repeats the first. Again many of the people mentioned in the list are described therein. The memoirs are <u>Twenty Years of my</u> <u>Life</u> (1915) and <u>My Long Life</u> (1939).

Sladen also appeared on B.B.C. television in 1938 in connection with <u>Who's Who</u> but there was, in 1969, no record of this in the B.B.C. archives.
