Volume of 6 books of notes by William Cunnington I on barrows, earthworks and camps in Wiltshire based on journeys in 1806, including Upavon, Marden, Roundway, Shrewton, Knap Hill, Cley Hill, Bromham, Morgan's Hill, Pewsey, Marlborough, Barbury, Oare, Chisbury, Bulford, Corton, Stonehenge, Codford, Bush Barrow, Upton Lovell, Barford Down, Wansdyke, Longbridge Deverill, Warminster, Upton Scudamore, Winterborne Stoke, Hilcot, Lake Downs, Durrington, Beckhampton, and the Rollright Stones in Oxfordshire. Also a note on the volume of Crocker water colour drawings done for Cunnington. A page of archaeological queries on Cunnington's finds, perhaps by William Cunnington III. A pencil note by William Cunningtonn III on the Cunnington I mss, almost illegible, and 2 pages of typewritten notes on the contents of the Cunnington deposit.
